The Commission has approved the adoption of the above rules with only those technical changes as directed by the Committee. A copy of those changes are submitted with this letter, and include a change to page 2 of Rule 25-7.101, at paragraph (7), line 14, to refer to Form PSC/AIT 124 (Rev. 04/13) as incorporated by reference in Rule 25-7.0131, rather than incorporate the same form by reference twice within the same Chapter, as well as a change to page 2 of Forms PSC/AFD 68, 69, 70, 67, 71, 244, 010-WL, 017-WL, 101-WS, and 017-WS (Rev. 04/13), to correct a reference to the title of Form PSC/AIT 124 (Rev. 04/13). A copy of Form PSC/AIT 124 (Rev. 04/13) is also included to show that the Fiscal Services Section staff member's name, phone, and FAX numbers have been removed from the bottom of page 1, and that the reference to Rule 25-7.101 has been removed from the form.

No rule hearing was necessary, as comments received during the rule proposal comment period were since withdrawn. Therefore, we plan to file the rules for adoption with the Department of State on April 15, 2013.

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1 25-7.101 Regulatory Assessment Fees<sub>7</sub>; Natural Gas Transmission Companies.

(1) As provided in Section 368.109, F.S., each natural gas transmission company shall
pay a regulatory assessment fee. The regulatory assessment fee shall be 0.25 percent annually
of the natural gas transmission company's gross operating revenue derived from intrastate
business, excluding sales of gas for resale to natural gas transmission companies, public
utilities that supply gas, municipal gas utilities and gas districts.

(2) Regulatory assessment fees are due each January 30 for the preceding 6 month
period or any part of the period from July 1 until December 31, and on July 30 for the
preceding 6 month period or any part of the period from January 1 until June 30.

10 (3) If the due date falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or a legal holiday, the due date is extended to the next business day. If the fees are sent by registered mail, the date of the 11 12 registration is the United States Postal Service's postmark date. If the fees are sent by certified 13 mail and the receipt is postmarked by a postal employee, the date on the receipt is the United 14 States Postal Service's postmark date. The postmarked certified mail receipt is evidence that 15 the fees were delivered. Regulatory assessment fees are considered paid on the date they are 16 postmarked by the United States Postal Service or received and logged in by the 17 Commission's Division of Administrative and Information Technology Services in Tallahassee. Fees are considered timely paid if properly addressed, with sufficient postage, 18 19 and postmarked no later than the due date.

Instructions For Filing Regulatory Assessment Fee Return

(Investor-Owned Electric Utility)

1. WHEN TO FILE: To avoid payment of penalties and interest, the Regulatory Assessment Fee Return and payment must be filed or postmarked:

On or before July 30 for the six-month period January 1 through June 30, and On or before January 30 for the six-month period July 1 through December 31.

However, if July 30 or January 30 falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or holiday, the Regulatory Assessment Fee Return may be filed or postmarked on the next business day, without penalty.

- 2. FEES: Each utility shall pay the currently authorized percentage, as indicated on Line 34 on the reverse side, of its gross operating revenues derived from intrastate business. Gross Operating Revenues are defined as the total revenues before expenses. The currently authorized percentage was implemented by Section 25-6.0131(1)(a), Florida Administrative Code. Annual revenue amounts are to be reported on the return for the period ended December 31.
- 3. FAILURE TO FILE BY DUE DATE: A Regulatory Assessment Fee Return must be completed, signed, and filed even if there are no revenues to report or if the minimum amount is due. Failure to file a return by the established due date will result in a penalty being added to the amount of fee due, 5% for each 30 days or fraction thereof, not to exceed a total penalty of 25% (Line 38). In addition, interest shall be added in the amount of 1% for each 30 days or fraction thereof, not to exceed a total of 12% per year (Line 39).
- 4. **EXTENSION:** A utility, for good cause shown in a written request, may be granted up to a 30-day extension. A request must be made by filing the enclosed *Regulatory Assessment Fee Extension Request* form (PSC/AIT 124), two weeks prior to the filing date. If an extension is granted, a charge shall be added to the amount due:
  - 0.75% of the fee to be remitted for an extension of 15 days or less, *or* 1.5% of the fee for an extension of 16 to 30 days.

In lieu of paying the charges outlined above, a utility may file a return and remit payment based upon estimated gross operating revenues by checking the "Estimated Return" space in the top left-hand corner on the reverse side. If such return is filed by the normal due date, the utility shall be granted a 30-day extension period in which to file and remit the actual fee due without paying the above charges, provided the estimated fee payment remitted is at least 90% of the actual fee due for the period.

- 5. **REGULATORY ASSESSMENT FEE DUE:** Amounts are due and payable to the Commission by either January 30 or July 30 depending on the reporting period. (Large Water Utility)

WHO MUST FILE: Each large regulated utility under the jurisdiction of the Florida Public Service Commission (Commission) for any part of the six-month periods, January 1 through June 30 and July 1 through December 31, preceding the due date as reflected in the following paragraph. A large utility is defined as a utility with annual revenues of Less than \$200,000 or more based on the most recent prior calendar year.
- 2. WHEN TO FILE: To avoid payment of penalties and interest, the Regulatory Assessment Fee Return form must be filed or postmarked:

On or before July 30 for the six-month period January 1 through June 30, and On or before January 30 for the six-month period July 1 through December 31.

### **Criteria for Extension Request**

- Form PSC/AIT 124, *Regulatory Assessment Fee Extension Request*, must contain a statement of good cause/reason for extension request. Examples of good cause include reasons such as financial hardship, severe illness, or acts of God; but do not include reasons such as management oversight or vacation time.
- The request for extension must be received by the Division of Administrative & IT Services at least two weeks before the Regulatory Assessment Fee due date.
- The request for extension will not be granted if the utility has any unpaid regulatory assessment fees, penalties, and/or interest due from a prior period(s).
- Please be aware that pursuant to Section 837.06, F.S., whoever knowingly makes a false statement in writing with the intent to mislead a public servant in the performance of his or her official duty shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree.
