On March 19, 2013, Florida Public Utilities Company (FPUC) submitted its Responses to the Office of Public Counsel's Areas of Concern, Attachment OPC-1 (Closing Statement) and Attachment OPC-2 (Exhibits to Asset Purchase Agreement), along with a Notice of Intent to Request Specified Confidential Classification. On April 9, 2013, FPUC submitted a Request for Confidential Classification of certain information in the attachments to its responses to OPC's "Areas of Concern", which were originally submitted under its Notice of Intent on March 19, 2013.

FPUC requests confidential classification of the highlighted rates and terms, which list specific customer account and bank account information and identification numbers that FPUC treats as proprietary and highly confidential. FPUC states that the release of the information referenced in OPC-1 and OPC-2 to the public would harm FPUC's business operations and ratepayers by impairing the Company's competitive business interests and disclosing sensitive customer account information, that both FPUC and its customers treat as confidential.

According to FPUC, the requested information is proprietary and confidential business information that FPUC seeks to keep confidential pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes (F.S.) and Rule 25-22.006(4), Florida Administrative Code. Based upon my review of the above referenced documents, the information meets the requirements for confidential classification and should be exempt from disclosure under Section 119.07, F.S.
