On May 20, 2013, pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes (F. S.), Tampa Electric Company (TECO) filed a request for confidential classification with respect to the highlighted information contained in Document Number 02764-13: Bates stamp pages 375-418; 805-814; 816-902; 954-1228; 555-803 and 904-908, in response to Office of Public Counsel's Fourth Request for Production of Documents. TECO states that the information contained in these documents should be classified as proprietary, confidential business information pursuant to Sections 366.093(3)(a), (d), and 366.093(3)(e), F.S.

TECO requests confidentiality under Subsection 366.093(3) F.S., which states:

(3) Proprietary confidential business information means information, regardless of form or characteristics, which is owned or controlled by the person or company, is intended to be and is treated by the person or company as private in that the disclosure of the information would cause harm to the ratepayers for the person's or company's business operations, and has not been disclosed unless disclosed pursuant to a statutory provision, an order of a court or administrative body, or private agreement that provides that the information will not be released to the public. Proprietary confidential business information includes, but is not limited to:

- (a) Trade secrets;
- (d) Information concerning bids or other contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of the company to contract for services on favorable terms;

(e) Employee personnel information unrelated to compensation, duties, qualifications, or responsibilities.

Upon review of the aforementioned documents, staff concurs with TECO that the highlighted information contained in Document Number 02764-13 meets the requirements for confidential classification pursuant to Section 366.093(1), (3)(d) and (e). Accordingly, this information should be treated as confidential.
