CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: So we're to Item Number 8.

MS. KING: Laura King, again, with Commission staff. Item 8 is a petition for approval of a new commercial/industrial service rider by Florida Power and Light. The proposed CISR tariff would give FPL the flexibility to negotiate discounts on the base energy and base demand charges with large commercial customers who can affirmatively demonstrate that they have viable lower-cost alternatives to receiving their electric service from FPL.

The CISR is available to both new and existing customers with loads of two megawatts or greater and will be limited to 50 contract service arrangements, or a total of 300 megawatts of load, whichever limit is reached first.

If approved, FPL will include in its monthly earnings surveillance reports the difference between the revenues which would have been received under the otherwise applicable tariff and the CISR rate. The proposed tariff does not affect the adjustment clauses and does not affect base rates between rate cases. Therefore, the general body of ratepayers are held harmless.

Staff recommends approval of the tariff and

TECO, and Duke CISR tariffs previously approved by the

Commission. Staff is prepared to answer your questions,

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you, staff.

Mr. Moyle.

MR. MOYLE: Thank you, Mr. Chairman, for giving me the opportunity to address you briefly this morning.

I'm here on behalf of the Florida Industrial Power Users Group, large users of electricity that are located in Florida.

And I wanted to commend FPL for bringing this forward. The other utilities, as staff indicated, have a CISR type arrangement in place. We think that this is a good tool to have, in addition to other tools that can address issues.

I just wanted to make the point that a lot of these businesses in Florida -- this tariff will apply to new businesses coming, but also existing businesses, and that a lot of these existing businesses are competing in markets in the southeast and globally, and electricity is a variable cost that is significant for them. So things that can be done to address that issue, such as this, are very important.

situation that involved the Tampa Electric Company with a prospective new customer that was coming, and you acted quickly to approve a special tariff. And one of the comments, I think, Commissioner Edgar, you made was to make sure that it was clear that these type of incentives also apply to existing businesses. Because it's great to have new jobs, we applaud that and support that, but it's also valuable to recognize existing jobs and existing businesses that are there making payroll every couple of weeks and paying ad valorem taxes. And we think this CISR is another good tool to accomplish that objective and just wanted to briefly go on the record.

Back, I think, last year you had another

We don't talk about the CISRs every day because they are things that get discussed with the utilities, but here is an opportunity to just officially go on the record supporting this as another tool to help address issues that may arise with important members of the Florida business community, so thank you.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you, Mr. Moyle. Florida Power and Light.

MR. GOORLAND: Good morning, Commissioners.

Thank you for the opportunity to speak today.

I'm Scott Goorland with Florida Power and

Light, and with me is Steve Romig, Director of Rates and Tariffs, with the company, as well.

FPL has proposed a new commercial/industrial service rider, CISR rate that will allow FPL to negotiate discounted rates to attract or retain large business customers that absent the discount would not otherwise be served by the utility.

FPL's customers in the state as a whole will benefit from the commercial/industrial customers' contribution to FPL's fixed costs, and also by the benefits that they will bring to the community in terms of secondary jobs and enhanced tax revenues.

As noted previously, FPL's proposal is very similar to other tariffs that have been previously approved by the Commission for Florida's other large electric utilities. FPL supports staff's recommendation and asks that you approve FPL's request.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you, sir.

Commissioners? Commissioner Balbis.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

And I just wanted to provide a brief comment.

I think that this tariff is a great mechanism for FPL to retain jobs in their service territory and even bring jobs in. So I fully support this, and at whatever time
