Dear Chairman Graham and Fellow Commissioners,

I am President of and writing to you on behalf of the Deaf Service Center Association of Florida. Many of our members are Regional Distribution Centers (RDC) for the Florida Telecommunications Relay, Inc. Telephone Equipment Distribution Program. We are in receipt of the PSC Memorandum of April 23, 2015 which discusses the proposed FTRI budget. Our primary concern is staff's recommendation that FTRI cut their budget by \$851,774 as opposed to them transferring the necessary funds from the relay surplus account.

A reduction of this magnitude would be significantly detrimental to FTRI's ability to perform the vital outreach necessary for this program. We understand the reluctance of transferring funds set aside for the Video Relay Service. However, by staff's own admission "The FCC has acknowledged that should it decide to mandate state funding, such transition would come with a reasonable phase in period of up to several years to provide states with sufficient notice". This fund has been sitting idle for many years now with no indication from the FCC that anything is imminent.

Even though the number of landlines is declining, the clients that we serve and the people who are in most need of this program are seniors who still have their landlines. FTRI has distributed 500,000+ phones since inception. Current estimates of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing population in Florida exceeds 3 million. We have come nowhere near providing this service to all the citizens who need it. It was the stated intent of the Legislature with respect to TASA to "establish a system whereby the citizens of Florida who are hearing impaired, speech impaired, or dual sensory impaired have access to basic telecommunication services". The Equipment Distribution program is a vital part of this provision. By not fully funding the FTRI program, the outreach portion of the program will suffer. Without funding devoted to a comprehensive outreach strategy many who deserve to participate in this program will not even know that it exists. Those of us on the front lines see this day in and day out. The RDCs simply do not have the resources to advertise at the necessary level to reach even a fraction of this community.

We urge you to fully fund the FTRI program budget as submitted under option one. Anything less would be a disservice to the hearing loss community who so desperately needs this assistance and in our opinion would not satisfy the intent of the legislature.

Thank you for your kind consideration of our request.
