Please see the Orlando Utilities Commission (OUC) responses to the second Florida Public Service Commission's Review of the 2015 DSM Plan.

1. As discussed in Section 1.2 of the company's petition, please discuss when the

winter peak demand reduction associated with the Custom Incentive, Indoor

Lighting Rebate, and Indoor Lighting Billed Solutions programs will be

quantified.

OUC Response:

OUC intends to quantify the winter peak demand reductions when information on participation for the currently unquantified programs included in OUC's DSM Plan (i.e. the commercial/industrial Custom Incentive, Indoor Lighting Rebate, and Indoor Lighting Billed Solution programs) becomes available, which is expected to be compiled at the end of January 2016. This information is needed in order to develop a baseline for what participating customers are interested in doing in terms of retrofitting to above current lighting and other energy codes and standards (i.e. HVAC, motors, etc.).

2. As discussed in Section 1.2 of the company's petition, when does OUC envision

filing for new commercial/industrial programs to address the winter peak

demand reduction goal?

OUC Response:

OUC frequently reviews and evaluates potential new demand-side management and energy efficiency measures and programs. At this time, OUC does not have a timeline for filing for new commercial/industrial programs. OUC expects that by including the winter peak demand reductions associated with the programs addressed in question number 1 above, the winter peak demand reductions for commercial/industrial will be achieved or exceeded without the addition of new commercial/industrial programs.
