FLORIDA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY'S REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION OF RESPONSE TO FLORIDA INDUSTRIAL POWER USERS GROUP'S REQUEST FOR PRODUCTION OF DOCUMENTS (No. 13)

Pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") requests confidential classification of its response to Florida Industrial Power Users Group's ("FIPUG") Request for Production of Documents (No. 13). In support of its request, FPL states:

- 1. On June 2nd, 2015, FPL served its supplemental response to FIPUG's Second Request for Production of Documents No. 13. The supplemental responsive documents comprise proprietary confidential business information within the meaning of Section 366.093(3), Florida Statutes (hereinafter referred to as the "Confidential Discovery Responses").
- 2. FPL files this request to FIPUG's Second Request for Production No. 13, in order to request confidential classification of the Confidential Discovery Responses consistent with Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code.
- 3. The following exhibits are included with and made a part of the original request and this request:
- a. Exhibit A consists of a compact disc containing the Confidential Discovery Responses produced in response to FIPUG's Second Request for Production of Documents No. 13. All of the pages of all responsive documents are confidential in their entirety. Accordingly, no purpose would be served by highlighting all of the text on the documents.

- b. Exhibit B consists of an identifying cover page indicating that all of the supplemental documents responsive to FIPUG's Second Request for Production of Documents No. 13 are confidential in their entirety. Because each page is confidential in its entirety, no purpose would be served by reproducing thousands of fully redacted pages.
- c. Exhibit C is a table containing an identification of the information highlighted in Exhibit A, together with a brief description of the documents designated confidential. Exhibit C also sets forth references to the specific statutory bases for the claim of confidentiality and to the affiant who supports the requested classification.
 - d. Exhibit D consists of the affidavit of Thomas L. Hartman.
- 4. FPL submits that the highlighted information in Exhibit A is proprietary confidential business information within the meaning of Section 366.093(3), Florida Statutes. This information is intended to be and is treated by FPL as private, and its confidentiality has been maintained. Pursuant to Section 366.093, such information is entitled to confidential treatment and is exempt from the disclosure provisions of the public records law. Thus, once the Commission determined that the information in question is proprietary confidential business information, the Commission is not required to engage in any further analysis or review such as weighing the hard of disclosure against the public interest in access to the information.
- 5. As the affidavit of Thomas L. Hartman included as Exhibit D indicates, the Confidential Discovery Responses provided by FPL constitute the proprietary business information of a third party related to the third party's competitive interests. Specifically, the materials consist of documents provided by CBAS Power Holdings, LLC or its subsidiaries or affiliates, which FPL is contractually obligated to treat confidentially. In addition, disclosure of

these materials would impair the competitive business of CBAS Power Holdings, LLC. This information is protected by Sections 366.093(3)(d) and (e), Fla. Stat.

6. Upon a finding by the Commission that the Confidential Information remains proprietary and confidential business information, the information should not be declassified for at least an additional eighteen (18) month period and should be returned to FPL as soon as it is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business. *See* § 366.093(4), Fla. Stat.

WHEREFORE, for the above and foregoing reasons, as more fully set forth in the supporting materials and affidavit included herewith, Florida Power & Light Company respectfully requests that its Request for Confidential Classification be granted.
