Staff requests approval to make an oral modification to Item 3, scheduled for the July 21, 2015 Commission Conference. A scrivener's error was made to the language on page 11 of Issue 1 of the recommendation. The only change to page 11 is the replacement of the phrase "production of documents" for the word "admission" in the second paragraph, as follows:

In addition, the limit of 30 interrogatories and requests for <u>admission</u> <u>production of documents</u> applies to the entire course of the docket. This procedure was followed in the FPUC Docket and in the AUF Docket, where OPC propounded discovery in both the PAA portion and the Section 120.57, F.S., proceeding in each docket. As discussed above, the prehearing officer has the discretion to grant more discovery or limit discovery pursuant to the applicable Florida Rules of Civil Procedure.
