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CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. I figure the sooner we get started, the sooner we can get done.

We will call this prehearing to order. Let the record show it is Monday at 2:00, and this is the fuel clause prehearing.

Staff, if -- excuse me. Staff, if I can get you to read the notice, please.

MS. MAPP: By notice issued October 5th, 2015, this time and place is set for a Prehearing Conference in the following dockets: 150001-EI, 150002-EG, 150003-GU, 150004-GU, and 150007-EI. The purpose of the prehearing is set out in the notice.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. I think we need to take appearances.

MAPP: Kyesha Mapp appearing in the 5 03 docket, Suzanne Brownless -- and making an appearance 6 7 for Suzanne Brownless, Danijela Janjic, and John Villafrate in the O1 docket; Lee Eng Tan and Bianca 8 9 Lherisson in the 02 docket; Leslie Ames and Kelley 10 Corbari in the 04 docket; and Charles Murphy in the 07 docket. 11 12 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Was that --13 MS. HELTON: Mary Anne Helton. I'm here as an advisor for you in all of the dockets. 14 MR. BECK: And Charlie Beck, General Counsel. 15 16 **CHAIRMAN GRAHAM:** Is that all the appearances? 17 Okay. So the order of the dockets today are 18 going to be the 03 docket, then the 04 docket, then the 19 02 docket, then the 07 docket, and then the 01 docket. 20 21 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: And we'll move on to the 22 02 docket. 23 Okay. Staff, any -- excuse me -- any 24 preliminary matters? 25 MS. TAN: At this point there are none and FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

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none are expected.

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CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Once again, we will proceed through the proceeding order -- I'm sorry -- we will proceed through the Draft Prehearing Order. We'll go through it section by section. Let me know if there's anything you want to change or alter.

Section I. Section II. Section III. Section IV. Section V.

MS. TAN: Chairman, FIPUG has raised objections to the expertise of all witnesses for whom no area of expertise were listed in the prefiled testimony. The IOUs have filed this information in the docket file on October 14th, 2015.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. So having reviewed that, are there still any objections, FIPUG?

MS. PUTNAL: Objections to the expertise of witnesses?

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Yes.

MS. PUTNAL: No, sir.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: No?

MS. PUTNAL: No, no objections.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Section VI. Section 23 VII.

MS. PUTNAL: In section VII, Chairman Graham, I believe FIPUG states throughout Section VII that it

was FIPUG's position at the time of preparing its prehearing statement that the parties must prove -- or the utility must prove -- carry its burden of proof in this matter. And at this point, after discussion with counsel, FIPUG is prepared to revise its prehearing statement to take no position on the issues and allow, if possible, a Type B stipulation to go forward.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Staff?

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MS. TAN: We will note that.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Anybody else on Section VII? Section VIII.

MS. TAN: And in addition, the Order Establishing Procedure does require that a party take a position at the Prehearing Conference unless good cause is shown as to why that party can't take a position at that time. And, accordingly, if the party's position shows a no position at this time, the party must change it at today's Prehearing Conference or show good cause why it can't take a position; otherwise, the Prehearing Order will reflect no position for that party for that issue.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: All right. So if any party wishes to change their position, please submit your position in writing no later than the end of the day tomorrow, which is October 20th.

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MR. REHWINKEL: Mr. Chairman, just for the record, the Public Counsel will be providing the same language for the 02 docket as for the 03 and 04 to facilitate a Type B stipulation on all the issues if the other parties and the staff are in agreement.

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CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Anything else on Section No. VIII? Okay. Section IX, exhibit list.

MS. TAN: Staff has prepared a Comprehensive Exhibit List which includes all prefiled testimony -all prefiled exhibits and also includes those exhibits staff wishes to include in the record. Staff will check with the parties prior to the hearing to determine if there's any objections to the Comprehensive Exhibit List or to any of staff's exhibits being entered into the record.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Anything in Section -- anything else in Section IX? Section X.

MS. TAN: At this time there are no proposed stipulations, but we are hopeful that the parties and staff will reach resolution.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Mr. Butler.

MR. BUTLER: I was going to comment that based on what I've heard, it sounds like, unless there are concerns staff has, that we are at a point where stipulation could be reached. I understand that FIPUG

has no position and would be willing to accept a Type B stipulation. And with suitable words to express their nuances on it, I believe that's Public Counsel's position as well. So I just would express for the record that so far as FPL can see, it looks like that we have the necessary elements for a stipulation on our issues.

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CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: That sounds good. Let's make it happen.

MS. TAN: And we can reflect that with the -after conferring with the parties, we can reflect that in the Prehearing Order.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Anybody else in Section X? Section XI.

MS. TAN: There are no pending motions in this docket.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Section XII.

MS. TAN: And there are no pending confidentiality orders.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Section XIII.

21 **MS. TAN:** Staff does believe, based on our 22 current discussion, that the issues in this docket may 23 be able to be stipulated. However, we did want to note 24 that if the parties agree to waive the briefs, the 25 Commission may make a bench decision for this portion of

the docket. And if there are any issues to be briefed, 1 2 we would recommend that the briefs be no longer than 20 3 pages. CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Is everybody in agreement to 4 that? Okay. Staff. 5 6 MS. TAN: And as such, those briefs would be 7 due on November 13th. CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Anything else on 8 9 Section XIII? Section XIV. It looks like opening statements will be, once again, limited to five minutes 10 per party. You can feel free to waive opening 11 12 statements. And once again, your briefs are limited to 13 20 pages. 14 Other matters, any other matters, staff? MS. TAN: There are no other matters to be 15 addressed. 16 17 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Anybody else have any other matters to come before us in this docket?
