COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: All right. Let's get this thing started. We will call the prehearing to order.

First, I want to apologize for the lateness of our start. When this was actually calendared, we weren't going to take up the Summertree water case, as you guys probably know more about water and wastewater than you ever wanted to know in your life, and that took 2.5 hours. So this should actually be 10:30 right now and not 1:00. Number one, that's the case.

Number two, I do appreciate all the pink I see in front of me. I -- as most of you know, that breast cancer has always been a dig deal to me, and whenever we have a meeting in October, I always encourage people to wear pink tops, pink dresses, pink ties, and so I just want everybody to know that that's not going unnoticed. And if that is it, staff, if I could get you to read the notice.

MS. TAN: By notice issued September 27th,
2016, this time and place was set for a prehearing in
the following dockets: 160001-EI, 160002-EG, 160003-GU,
160004-GU, and 160007-EI. The purpose of the prehearing
is set out in the notice.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Thank you. Staff.

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We're going to take appearances, and if I could have 1 you, when you give your names or give your company, you 2 3 don't have to do it each individual, but when you give the company and the names, also give the dockets that 4 you're being a part of all at one time. And I guess we 5 can start right up here with Florida Power & Light. 6 7 MR. BUTLER: Thank you, Commissioner Graham. For the 01 docket I have R. Wade Litchfield, John 8 9 Butler, and Maria Moncada. We also would be making appearances in Docket 160007, the ECRC. And then for 10 the 02 docket, R. Wade Litchfield, John Butler, and 11 12 Kenneth Rubin. Thank you. 13 14 15

MR. BADDERS: Good afternoon. Russell Badders on behalf of Gulf Power. I'll be appearing in 01 and 02 and 07 dockets along with Steven R. Griffin and Jeffrey A. Stone.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Okay.

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MR. BEASLEY: Good afternoon. James D. Beasley with the Ausley McMullen law firm. Appearing with me are J. Jeffry Wahlen and Ashley M. Daniels of the same firm in the 01, 02, and 07 dockets.

MR. WATSON: Ansley Watson, Jr., Macfarlane, Ferguson & McMullen in the 03 and 04 dockets.

MS. KEATING: Good afternoon, Commissioner. Beth Keating with the Gunster law firm. I'm here today for FPUC in the 01, 02, 03, and 04 dockets; FPU-Fort

Meade in the 03 docket; and Fort Meade, the Indiantown

Division, and Chesapeake in the 04 docket.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Okay.

MR. WRIGHT: Good afternoon, Commissioner.

MR. MOYLE: Good afternoon. Jon Moyle with the Moyle Law Firm appearing on behalf of the Florida Industrial Power Users Group in the 01, 02, and 07 dockets. And Karen Putnal with the firm should also be noted as entering an appearance. Thank you.

MS. CHRISTENSEN: Patricia Christensen with the Office of Public Counsel. And I'd also like to put in an appearance for J. R. Kelly, Public Counsel; Charles Rehwinkel; and Erik Sayler with the Office of

Public Counsel in the 01, 02, 03, 04, and 07 dockets.

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MS. LEITMAN: Melanie Leitman appearing on behalf of my co-counsel, Paula Sparkman, out of Messer, Caparello representing Sebring Gas of the 04 docket.

MR. BERNIER: Good afternoon, Commissioner. Matt Bernier with Duke Energy and entering an appearance in the 01, 02, and 07 dockets. And I'd like to enter an appearance for Dianne Triplett in those same dockets and for John Burnett in the 01 docket. Thank you.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Anybody else before I go to staff for appearances?

MS. CHRISTENSEN: Can I also add -- this is Patty Christensen with the Office of Public Counsel -an appearance for Stephanie Morris in all of the dockets as well.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Anybody else before I go to staff?

Staff.

MS. TAN: Lee Eng Tan on behalf of the 02 docket, and making an appearance for Stephanie Cuello in the 02 and 04 docket, and Margo Leathers and Wesley Taylor in the 03 docket, Kelley Corbari in the 04 docket, Bianca Lherisson and Charlie Murphy in the 07 docket, and Danijela Janjic and Suzanne Brownless in the 01 docket.

MS. HELTON: And finally, Mary Anne Helton.

I'm here as your advisor. I'd also like to make an

appearance for your General Counsel, Keith Hetrick.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Okay. The order of dockets. We're going to take the 02, 03, 04, 07, and then back to the 01 docket. That's the order we're going to handle this.

So we'll start with the 02 docket. Any preliminary matters?

MS. TAN: At this point there are none and none are expected.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Okay. So let's go through the draft prehearing order. I'm going to probably go through these pretty quickly, so if we get to a section that you have any concerns or want to speak about, if you can just kind of wave or grunt or get my attention, I'll slow down.

So let's start with Section No. I, Section No. II, Section No. III, Section No. IV, Section No. V, Section No. VI, Section No. VII, Section No. VIII. Staff.

MS. TAN: Commissioner, the Order Establishing Procedure requires that a party take a position at the prehearing conference unless good cause is shown as to why the party can't take a position at this time.

Accordingly, if a party's position in the draft 1 prehearing order is currently "No position at this 2 3 time," the party must change it at today's prehearing conference or show good cause why it can't take a 4 position. Otherwise, the prehearing order will reflect 5 "No position" for that party for that issue. 6 7 COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Does anybody want to change their position or add a position? 8 Okay. Existing list -- I'm sorry -- exhibit 9 list. 10 Commissioner, I'd also just add that 11 MS. TAN: 12 if anyone does want to change their position, that they would do so by tomorrow, close of business. 13 14 COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Okay. MS. TAN: And in the exhibit list, 15 16 17

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Commissioner, staff has prepared a Comprehensive Exhibit List which includes all prefiled exhibits and includes those exhibits which staff wishes to include in the record. Staff will check with the parties prior to the hearing to determine if there are any objections to the Comprehensive Exhibit List or to any of staff's exhibits being entered into the record.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Okay. Let's go on to Section X, proposed stipulations.

MS. TAN: There are no proposed stipulations

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at this time.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: XI, pending motions.

MS. TAN: We dealt with a pending motion at
the pre -- at the agenda conference today.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Okay. No. XII.

MS. TAN: There are three outstanding confidentiality orders that we will have to you before the end of this week.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Okay. No. XIII.

MS. TAN: Staff believes that in this -- the issues in this docket may be able to be stipulated; however, staff did want to note a few post-hearing procedures. If the parties agree to waive briefs, the Commission may make a bench decision for this portion of the docket. If there are any issues to be briefed, the staff recommends the post-hearing briefs be no longer than 40 pages, and that if there are any briefs, they would be due on November 14th, 2016.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Is everybody in agreement with those? Okay. I'm seeing everybody nod their heads and no one is saying they're not in agreement, so I will assume everybody is in agreement.

Okay. Section XIV, opening statements.

They're going to be limited to three minutes per party
for not just this docket but for all the dockets. And

feel free to not have an opening statement, if you choose not to have one.

Once again, as staff says, the brief is going to be limited to 40 pages.

Other matters?

MS. TAN: There are no other matters to address in this docket.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Does anybody else have any other matters or any last thing to say before we adjourn this prehearing for the 02? Seeing none, we'll adjourn the 02 docket and proceed to the 03.
