RIDER GSDHLF

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GENERAL SERVICE DEMAND HIGH LOAD FACTOR

AVAILABILITY:

Available throughout the entire territory served by the Ocala Electric Utility.

APPLICABLE:

To any demand customer served under the Utility's GSD tariff who maintains a billable demand level in excess of 500 kVA during six (6) months of a twelve (12) month period and has entered into a perpetuating five (5) year General Service Demand High Load Factor Service Agreement with the Ocala Electric Utility.

RATE SCHEDULE:

Customer will pay all applicable charges for service under the designated GSD rate schedule.

HIGH LOAD FACTOR CREDIT:

For any billing period for which a demand customer's load factor shall be sixty percent (60%) or higher, a high load factor demand credit in the amount shown below will be applied to the customer's bill.

<u>Load Factor</u>	<u>Monthly Demand Credit</u>
75 percent & higher	\$1.50 per kVA demand unit
70 to 74 percent	\$1.25 per kVA demand unit
65 to 69 percent	\$1.00 per kVA demand unit
60 to 64 percent	\$0.75 per kVA demand unit

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~~GENERAL SERVICE DEMAND HIGH LOAD FACTOR~~~~(cont.)~~RESERVED FORFUTURE USEDETERMINATION OF LOAD FACTOR:

The customer's load factor (LF) for any billing period shall be determined by the following formula:

$$LF = ME / (CPD * DBP * 24)$$

Where:

ME = Metered energy in kWh for the billing period.

CPD = Calculated peak demand in kW for the billing period.

(The maximum indicated kVA demand is multiplied by the coincidental power factor for that demand interval to arrive at kW demand.)

DBP = The number of days in billing period.

24 = Number of hours per day.

The load factor as determined by the above formula will be expressed as a whole percent amount with fractional amounts being disregarded.

TERM OF SERVICE:

Service under this rider shall be for a minimum initial term of five (5) years from the date of execution of the General Service Demand High Load Factor Service Agreement with the Ocala Electric Utility. Upon completing the initial term, subsequent perpetuating five year terms, similar to the initial term, will remain effective unless terminated as described herein. Customers desiring to terminate this contract at the end of the initial five (5) year term shall give the Ocala Electric Utility a minimum of twelve (12) months prior notice.

PENALTY FOR EARLY TERMINATION:

A customer who elects to terminate the General Service Demand High Load Factor Electric Service Agreement with the Ocala Electric Utility after the initial five (5) year term and with less than the required twelve (12) months prior notice will be subject to an early termination penalty of refundment for the amount credited during the particular five (5) year term, plus interest, at twelve percent (12%) per annum.
