I am writing you regarding the Utilities, Inc. FL rate increase. I understand that the Public Service Commission staff's recommendation is to accept about 80% of the rate increase (\$5.5 million of the \$6.9 million) when they make their final decision on August 3, 2017.

IF this new consolidated rate increase recommended by Staff is approved, Seminole County residents will have the burden of paying \$3,858,438 million of the \$5,512,904 rate increase.

I can only assume that the staff doesn't live in Seminole County since they have put the majority of the burden of the increase on us.
