MS. DUVAL: Thank you, Commissioner.

By notice issued September 27th, 2017, this time and place was set for a prehearing in the following dockets: 20170001-EI, 20170002-EG, 20170003-GU, 20170004-GU, and 20170007-EI. The purpose of the prehearing is set out in the notice.

COMMISSIONER BRISE: Thank you. And so at this time, we'll take appearances, and staff has suggested, and I think it's a great suggestion, that we will take appearances for all of the dockets at one time. And so at this point, we'll take appearances.

MR. BUTLER: Thank you, Commissioner. John Butler appearing for Florida Power & Light Company in the 01, 02, and 07 dockets. I'd also like to enter appearances for Wade Litchfield in the 01, 02, and 07 dockets, Ken Rubin in the 02 docket, Jessica Cano in the 07 docket, and Maria Moncada in the 01 docket. Thank

you.

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COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Thank you.

MR. BERNIER: Good afternoon, Commissioner. Matt Bernier for Duke Energy. I'll be entering an appearance in the 01, 02, and 07 dockets. And I'd also like to enter an appearance for Dianne Triplett in those same dockets.

COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Okay. Thank you.

7	COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Let's move on to 04. All
8	right. Ms. Cuello, are there any preliminary matters
9	that we need to address before we get to the Draft
10	Prehearing Order?
11	MS. CUELLO: Yes, Commissioner. Staff will
12	note for the record that Peoples Gas System and St. Joe
13	Natural Gas Company have been excused from the
14	prehearing in the 04 docket. Staff will also note that
15	proposed stipulations have been reached on all issues as
16	they pertain to Peoples Gas System, St. Joe Natural Gas
17	Company, Sebring Gas Systems, and FPUC. And the Office
18	of Public Counsel has indicated that they will agree to
19	a Type 2 stipulation. If stipulations can be reached in
20	the next few days on the issues pertaining to the
21	remaining party, the Prehearing Order will need to be
22	modified to reflect such agreements. If such agreements
23	are reached, staff proposes to circulate an amended
24	draft before an order is issued. And aside from that,
25	there are no other preliminary matters that staff is

aware of.

COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Okay. Does any party have a preliminary matter?

MR. REHWINKEL: Yes, Commissioner. Charles Rehwinkel. I agree with what Ms. Cuello said. The only thing I would add is that we have indicated we are going to revert or default to the "No position" on all the issues. So technically we are going to facilitate a Type 2 stipulation and not affirmatively agree to it. But, yes, we, we will go to that position and the stipulations can occur, if worked out with the other parties.

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COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Okay. Thank you.

All right. Any other preliminary matter from any parties?

Okay. So let's proceed through the Draft Prehearing Order. I'll identify sections, and I want you, the parties, to let me know if there are any corrections or changes that need to be made. We'll go through this quickly, so please speak up if you have a change or a correction that needs to be made.

Section I, case background.

Section II, conduct for proceedings -- or of proceedings.

Section III, jurisdiction.

Section IV, procedure for handling 1 confidential information. 2 3 Section V, prefiled testimony and exhibits and witnesses. 4 Section VI, order of witnesses. 5 MS. CUELLO: Yes, Commissioner. Looking at 6 7 the positions that the parties have taken in this docket, staff is hopeful that full stipulations can be 8 9 reached and witnesses excused, and staff will continue to work toward this end. 10 COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Okay. Thank you. 11 12 Basic positions. Okay. Section XIII, issues and positions. 13 14 MS. CUELLO: Staff will note that the Order 15 Establishing Procedure requires that a party take a position at the Prehearing Conference, unless good cause 16 17 is shown as to why that party cannot take a position at 18 this time. Accordingly, if a party's position in the 19 Draft Prehearing Order is currently "No position at this 20 time," that party must change its position or show good 21 cause why it cannot take a position. 22 Staff would also suggest that parties who have 23 heretofore not taken a position or wish to change their 24 position be allowed to submit their position in writing no later than close of business tomorrow, October 12th.

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If a party fails to take a position by that time, the Prehearing Order will reflect "No position" for that party on such issues.

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COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Okay. So we've been through this a couple of times already today, so I think that's relatively clear. Does anyone have any changes to positions that they want to put into the record at this time? Okay. If not, then we have until the end of tomorrow, October 12th, and the close of business, that is.

All right. Section XIV, exhibit list.

MS. CUELLO: Staff will note that it's prepared a Draft Comprehensive Exhibit List which includes all prefiled exhibits and includes those exhibits staff wishes to include in their record. Staff will circulate the draft list to determine if there are any objections to the Draft Comprehensive Exhibit List or any of staff's exhibits being entered into the record.

COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Okay. Thank you. Proposed stipulations.

MS. CUELLO: As mentioned before, proposed stipulations have been reached on all issues as they pertain to Peoples Gas System, St. Joe Natural Gas Company, Sebring Gas System, and FPUC. Staff is still

waiting -- sorry. 1 COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: No problem. 2 MS. CUELLO: Staff is still waiting to hear 3 from Florida City Gas regarding stipulations; however, 4 staff believes proposed stipulations will be reached on 5 all the issues. 6 COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: All right. Thank you. 7 Pending motions. 8 9 MS. CUELLO: There are no pending motions. **COMMISSIONER BRISÉ:** Pending confidentiality 10 motions. 11 12 MS. CUELLO: There is one pending confidentiality motion that staff believes will be 13 14 satisfied by the end of the week. COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: All right. Thank you. 15 Post-hearing procedures. 16 17 MS. CUELLO: If issues are stipulated and the 18 parties agree to waive briefs, the Commission may make a 19 bench decision for this portion of the docket. If there are any issues to be briefed, staff recommends 20

MS. CUELLO: And staff also notes that any
