On behalf of the Polk County Board of County Commissioners, this letter is in support of Tampa Electric's proposed Lighting Conversion Program. Polk County has a 40 (+) year productive business relationship, with TECO. They currently provide lighting support to numerous residential street lighting districts within Polk County, perimeter lighting of several of our utility plant operations, numerous street intersections/roadway corridor lighting fixtures, recreational lighting at several of our community parks and permeter/security lighting at several public parking lots.
