On March 30, 2018, Florida power and Light (FPL) filed its exhibits to the 2017 consummation report in the above referenced docket. Pursuant to Section 366.093(3)(d)(e) of the Florida Statutes (F.S.), and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C), Florida Power & Light Company requests confidential classification of certain highlighted information on Document No. 02627-2018. This memo addresses only the information provided in Exhibit A (Term Loans Nos. 1-3 and Squire Patton Boggs Opinion Nos. 1 and 2) to FPL's 2017 consummation report.

FPL claims that the information is intended to be and has been treated as private. Staff has reviewed FPL's confidentiality request and the exhibits to FPL's 2017 consummation report. Staff concurs that the exhibits to FPL's 2017 consummation report contain proprietary and confidential information concerning contractual data and information relating to competitive business interests, the disclosure of which could harm the competitive interests of the company and impair the competitive business of the provider of information. As such, this information is protected by Section 366.093(3)(d)(e), F.S.

In staff's opinion, the request meets the criteria for confidentiality set forth in section 366.093(3)(d)(e), F.S. Therefore, staff recommends that FPL's request for confidentiality be approved.
