1 PROCEEDINGS As I said before, Item No. 5 2 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: 3 is deferred, so let's revert back to Item No. 3. MS. GERVASI: Commissioners, Item No. 3 is 4 5 staff's recommendation in Docket No. 20180143-EI to 6 grant the petition to initiate rule-making to amend 7 Rule 25-6.0426 FAC, recovery of economic 8 development expenses filed by FPL, Gulf Power and 9 Tampa Electric Company. 10 This recommendation is for the Commission to 11 initiate rule-making proceedings in order to 12 collect information and evaluate whether the 13 Commission should propose to adopt the petitioner's 14 suggested rule amendments at a later date. 15 It is my understanding that the Office of 16 Public Counsel, Charles Rehwinkel, is here to 17 address the Commission on this item. 18 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you, OPC. 19 MR. REHWINKEL: Thank you, Mr. Chairman and 20 Commissioners. Charles Rehwinkel, Deputy Public 21 Counsel. 22 I am not here to speak against this process or 23 the petition. I am not here to ask that you not 24 initiate rule-making. I am here to make an 25 observation and request to the Commission.

Well over a year ago, closer to a
year-and-a-half ago, the customers asked in a
separate process in a rule-making on operating
margin policy for you to undertake to adopt a rule
for a policy that had been in place for 21 years.
You agreed to do this. Nearly a year went by until
a draft appeared.

8 Next month, we are hopeful to see a 9 rule-making proposal from the Commission. We are 10 not complaining about that, but less than 30 days 11 ago, the four biggest utilities in this state filed 12 a petition, and now 29 days later a rule-making 13 process is being opened up.

We want to observe and note that there may be a difference, and we hope that's not the case, between the powerless and the powerful in this state when it comes to getting what people need and what they want.

19I am not saying the operating margin rule is20on par with an economic development rule that might21help everyone. It's just a matter of the process.22What we are asking you to do is to take the23time and be deliberative, which I think in fairness24to your staff they are saying is what they want, is25to take time to gather information to decide

whether to even propose a rule. But there is nothing wrong with taking time to make sure that you get it right when it comes to what we would consider discretionary spending by utilities.

5 We are at a time right now where some of the 6 utilities have passed through or agreed to pass 7 through all of their tax savings, and some have not 8 necessarily done that.

9 When we are sitting here deciding whether to 10 do discretionary spending, I think it's imperative 11 that we clear the decks on the taxings savings and 12 storm issues that are, in some ways, taken together 13 before we rush into adding an expense to the bottom 14 line; because in the end, what matters most to the 15 economic development from my experience in economic 16 development is utility rates, and low rates are the 17 best form of economic development incentive.

18 So we are not opposing this. We think that 19 there could be merit to what the petitioners are 20 asking for, but we are just asking that this 21 process not be rushed along. We may even ask, and 22 not as a method of opposition, but to make sure we 23 have a good record, because I was around 30 years 24 ago, 35 years ago, when economic development 25 expenditures were part of a problem and in a

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1 mismanagement case. And it's something I think the 2 Commission needs to be very careful about when you 3 loosen the reigns on economic development spending, 4 because there are potential problems in that area. 5 And I am not saying we are going to have that in 6 the future, but it may be important that the 7 Commission build a really good record and 8 understand what economic development spending is 9 all about.

10 One of the tools available to interested 11 parties and certainly the Public Counsel 12 representing the customers would be one of those, 13 is to have a draw-out, where you take evidence and 14 you have testimony before you conclude a 15 rule-making.

16 We are not here to say that we are going to do 17 that, but it is a tool and an option available to a 18 decision-maker like yourself that will be making 19 really an important change in a process that has 20 been in place for 20 years. It may well be time to 21 revisit this issue and to raise the cap. 22 The Public Counsel will commit to you, and 23 will commit to the utilities that have filed this

24 petition, that we will work to find a solution that

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is in the best interest of everyone, but our ask is

1 that this not be rushed along, and that us be given the deliberation and time that it deserves. 2 3 Thank you. 4 COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Thank you, Mr. 5 Rehwinkel. 6 I agree with you. The first thing is you 7 started off, you said that this was sponsored by 8 four of the largest utilities. I only have three. 9 MR. REHWINKEL: Then I am in error. I was 10 counting them all, and --11 I am not saying that that CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: 12 fourth one is not supportive. I am just saying he 13 is not on here. 14 MR. REHWINKEL: I stand corrected. Thank you. 15 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Second, I agree. Some of 16 this stuff is kind of vague. The one that popped 17 out to me was on page nine, line number 23, that 18 Making financial contributions to state and says: 19 local governments to assist strategic planning 20 efforts, I have no idea what that means and it 21 sounds just pretty wide open. 22 But the reality is this is just starting 23 rule-making, so I am sure our staff and everybody 24 else that's involved can start to pin down and make 25 sure exactly what things like that mean. And there

is quite a few of those in here, but that's my concern.

And I think what I want to put on the record, and make sure staff is paying attention to, because as Mr. Rehwinkel said, 30 years ago, when some of these things probably went astray is because a lot of these options were just too broad and people did things that they probably shouldn't have.

9 I have some commissioners who want to speak. 10 Commissioner Polmann.

COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you, Mr.
 Chairman.

13I appreciate Mr. Rehwinkel coming forward and14raising the questions and making comments that he15did, and I share in some of his thoughts.

Mr. Rehwinkel, I had very similar thoughts when I first read through this item, and I am not as familiar as you are with the background here, but I had a very similar question on my reading that, you know, who pays and who benefits?

21 And I had a discussion with staff along those 22 lines, and had a very good briefing on this item, 23 and I am appreciative of the concern, and I am also 24 comforted by the fact that this is just an 25 initiation. And I was assured that the purpose

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1 here is to open up the process in that it's both 2 timely and appropriate that we go through a 3 thorough examination. 4 And staff did assure me that the intention as 5 to gather as much information as we can, and that 6 this will be very open. And I took some comfort in 7 that, that everybody will be involved. 8 And I really do appreciate you coming forward 9 with that, and your commitment for full 10 involvement. I expect that we are going to have 11 This is a very significant issue many questions. 12 to our state, but I want to make sure that the 13 appropriate people are benefited, and that this is 14 not simply a burden on the ratepayers. That is not 15 at all the appropriate things to do, and I want to 16 make sure everyone is involved and has an 17 opportunity through workshop. That was my concern 18 about, you know, we are not burdening 19 inappropriately, but that there is a benefit for 20 economic development. I think that is an important 21 part of what we are doing here. 22 I thank you again for many could go forward, 23 thank you, Mr. Chairman. 24 Commissioner Brown. COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: 25 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you.

1 I see we have a new gentleman at the --2 MS. KING: Yes, I am Jim King, Senior Attorney 3 for FPL. 4 I just wanted to say, we are supportive of the 5 staff recommendation to initiate the proceeding. 6 And it is our intent to develop the record, answer 7 questions, participate in workshops to develop the 8 record, to answer any questions that do come up. 9 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you. And thank 10 you, Mr. Chairman. I just wanted -- Mr. Rehwinkel, thank you for 11 12 being here and for expressing your concerns. And I 13 do think maybe it is time to revisit the cap. And 14 so I look forward to the initiation of these 15 proceedings. 16 But you did raise a point about the comparison 17 of the operating ratio methodology in this 18 proceeding. If we could just have staff kind of 19 walk us through the timeframe and clarify any 20 concerns, or address any concerns that Mr. 21 Rehwinkel had regarding the two different rules. 22 Commissioner, I can tell you MS. GERVASI: 23 that the reason we got to agenda so guickly on this 24 one has nothing do with the powerful versus the 25 powerless, and everything to do with Section

1 120.54(7)(a), Florida Statutes, which requires the Commission to either initiate rule-making 2 proceedings or deny the petition to initiate 3 4 rule-making with a written statement of its reasons 5 for the denial not later than 30 calendar days 6 following the date of the filing of the petition. 7 Now, I am not involved in that other rule, so 8 I don't know exactly where we are with respect to 9 that, but I would suspect that we would have done 10 the same thing. We would have been required by law 11 to do the same thing if that rule was opened up at 12 the request of a interested person. 13 Oftentimes, we initiate rule-making on our 14 own, and then we don't have that requirement. So 15 that may have happened in that case as well. 16 COMMISSIONER BROWN: You are good, Ms. 17 Gervasi. 18 MS. GERVASI: Thank you. 19 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you so much for 20 that clarification. 21 Okay. CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Any other 22 commissioners? Seeing none, I will entertain a 23 motion. 24 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Move staff. 25 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Second.

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1 It's been moved and seconded CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: 2 staff recommendation on Item No. 3. 3 Is there any further comments? 4 Seeing none, all in favor, say aye. 5 (Chorus of ayes.) 6 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Any opposed? 7 (No response.) 8 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: By your action, you have 9 approved the staff recommendation on Item No. 3. 10 This concludes our agenda. Okay.
