2	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Let's move into the 03
3	docket.
4	Nobody needs to change chairs, okay. We will
5	move.
6	Mr. Schrader, any preliminary matters to
7	address in this draft prehearing order?
8	MR. SCHRADER: Yes, Commissioner, there are
9	two.
10	First, staff would like to note for the record
11	that St. Joe Natural Gas Company has been excused
12	from the prehearing in this docket.
13	Also, staff wants to note that there is a
14	pending motion in this docket that is FCG's agreed
15	motion to its supplemental direct testimony filed
16	on October 15th, 2018.
17	COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. Would FCG
18	like to gave brief summary of its motion?
19	MS. KEATING: Absolutely, Commissioner. Thank
20	you.
21	I am very happy to report that Florida City
22	Gas and the Office of Public Counsel have reached a
23	stipulation in Florida City Gas' limited proceeding
24	in Docket 20180154. As a result of that
25	stipulation, Florida City Gas has agreed to, if the

1	Commission approves the stipulation in 20180154, to
2	flow through the remaining tax benefits as a credit
3	to the PGA; and as such, in compliance with that
4	stipulation and settlement we have moved to ask
5	leave to submit additional testimony to support the
6	calculation of that credit in the event the
7	Commission approves the stipulation and settlement.
8	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Mr. Schrader.
9	MR. SCHRADER: Staff recommends that FCG's
10	motion be granted.
11	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Any of the parties
12	plan to file a written response?
13	MS. CHRISTENSEN: No.
14	COMMISSIONER CLARK: No one?
15	All right. Very good.
16	MS. KEATING: Thank you, Commissioner.
17	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Any other party have any
18	other preliminary matter?
19	Okay. We will go through the prehearing order
20	part by part.
21	Section I, Case Background.
22	Section II, Conduct of Proceedings.
23	III, Jurisdiction.

3	MR. SCHRADER: Staff is hopeful that all
4	issues with the parties can be stipulated and
5	witnesses excused in this docket. Staff will
6	continue to work towards this end.
7	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Section VII, Basic
8	Positions.
9	Section VIII, Issues and Positions.
10	MR. SCHRADER: Staff notes that the order
11	establishing procedure requires that a party take a
12	position at the prehearing conference unless good
13	cause is shown as to why that party cannot take a
14	position at that time.
15	Accordingly, if a party's position in a draft
16	prehearing order is currently no position at this
17	time, that party must change its position or show
18	good cause why it cannot take a position.
19	Further, staff would also like to suggest that
20	parties who have not yet taken a position, or wish
21	to change their position, be allowed to submit
22	their position in writing no later than noon
23	tomorrow, Wednesday, October 24th. If a party
24	fails to take a position at that time, the
25	prehearing order will reflect no position for that

1	party on such issues.
2	Finally, FCG and OPC have agreed to FCG's
3	request to submit supplemental testimony in this
4	proceeding and to include an additional issue in
5	this proceeding includes Issue No. 7 in a
6	prehearing order regarding application by FCG of a
7	tax savings credit to each customer's PGA charge
8	for the calendar year 2019. Issue No. 7 is the
9	subject of FCG's pending agreed motion to accept
10	supplemental direct testimony which was filed on
11	October 15th.
12	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Anyone object to
13	this being included? All right. Very good.
14	Let's move to Section IX, Exhibit List.
15	MR. SCHRADER: I am sorry, Commissioner?
16	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Section IX, Exhibit List.
17	MR. SCHRADER: Yes. Staff will note that it
18	has prepared and circulated to the parties a draft

12	MR. SCHRADER: There are no pending
13	confidentiality requests.
14	COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. And Section
15	XIII, Post-Hearing Procedures.
16	MR. SCHRADER: If issues are stipulated and
17	parties agree to waive briefs, the Commission may
18	make a bench decision for this portion of the
19	docket.
20	If there are any issues to be briefed, staff
21	recommends that post-hearing briefs be no longer
22	than 40 pages.
23	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Moving
24	MR. SCHRADER: Staff I am sorry, go ahead.
25	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Moving to rulings.

1	MR. SCHRADER: Okay. Staff notes that any
2	briefs will be due on November 16th, 2018.
3	Rulings, Commissioner, would you like to make
4	a ruling on the pending motion?
5	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Yes, sir.
