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1 PROCEEDINGS 2 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. We're moving on down 3 to Item No. 16. 4 MS. GUFFNEY: Good morning, Chairman Graham 5 and Commissioners. Sevini Guffey with Commission 6 staff. 7 Item 16 is petition from Florida City Gas 8 requesting Commission approval of their proposed 9 2019 safety access and facility enhancement 10 surcharges, or sur-factors [sic], to relocate 11 existing gas mains and associated facilities from rear easements to the street front. 12 13 The SAFE program considers maintenance, 14 access, customer encroachments, leak incidents, 15 material and age of pipe, and operating pressure of 16 the pipelines where they prioritize their 17 replacements. 18 For 2019, the proposed SAFE surcharge for 19 residential customer will be 21 cents; while, for 20 large customers, the proposed surcharge would be 40 21 cents. 22 There have been no customer comments on this 23 docket. And staff recommends approval and is 24 available to answer questions. Office of the 25 Public Counsel is also here to speak regarding the

1 inclusion of interest when they calculate the sur- -- SAFE factors for the future. 2 And 3 additionally, Ms. Keating and Mr. Wright, on behalf 4 of City Gas is also here to answer questions. 5 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you, staff. 6 Ms. Keating, I'm going to go to OPC first and 7 then back to you. Mr. Rehwinkel. 8 9 MR. REHWINKEL: Thank you, Chairman and 10 I'm Charles Rehwinkel with the Commissioners. 11 Office of Public Counsel. We are here generally in 12 support of your staff's recommendation, as well as 13 the tariff that the company has filed. 14 Like Commissioner Brown, we have worked since 15 the inception of these riders, which are 16 overwhelming a safety feature, and hopefully will 17 allow the State of Florida to avoid some of the 18 issues that other states have encountered. So, we 19 commend the Commission for what they're doing and 20 the company for what they're doing. 21 We have a process issue that we've talked to 22 staff and the company with -- and I think we're all 23 in agreement. There is an over-recovery in this 24 case that, because of the way this tariff or rider 25 evolved, since its inception, did not have an

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1	accrual of interest for the credit of the
2	customers, it's about \$5,300.
3	It does not move the needle with respect to
4	the tariff rates, but we just want to ask that,
5	from here forward, that the interest be accrued;
6	whether it's in the company's favor on an under-
7	recovery or the customer's favor on an over-
8	recovery, that it be accounted for.
9	We even would ask that next time when this
10	this rider comes around for approval next year,
11	that they capture this credit to the customers'
12	impact to to offset or add to whatever credit or
13	debit for interest is included in the calculation.
14	That's all we're asking and and I think
15	otherwise, we fully support the rec.
16	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Ms. Keating?
17	MS. KEATING: Good morning, Commissioners.
18	Beth Keating with the Gunster Law Firm here today
19	for Florida City Gas.
20	We also support your staff's recommendation
21	and Florida City Gas is not opposed to including
22	interest on a going-forward basis.
23	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Commissioners,
24	comments, concerns, motions?
25	Commissioner Polmann.

1 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you, 2 Mr. Chairman. 3 Can I get clarification on Ms. Keating's 4 comment, going-forward basis? Is that inclusive of 5 this item? 6 MS. KEATING: The tariff --7 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Yeah --8 MS. KEATING: -- to be implemented in 9 January 2019 would be what was filed in this 10 proceeding. 11 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. 12 MS. KEATING: But the interest would be 13 included in true-up for next year. 14 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. And 15 Mr. Rehwinkel, you're fine with that? 16 MR. REHWINKEL: That's exactly what we intend, 17 and we appreciate the company's willingness to make 18 the adjustment. 19 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. Mr. Chairman, it 20 would seem to me that, as Mr. Rehwinkel indicated, 21 this could go either way, and whether it's an over 22 or under could go to the -- to the customer benefit 23 or to the utility benefit. So, that -- that seems 24 entirely reasonable to me, since you don't know 25 which way we'll end up, either over or under.

1	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: They're just looking for
2	full disclosure.
3	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Yeah. So, with that
4	understanding, I would move approval of the item on
5	all issues.
6	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: It's been moved and second,
7	staff recommendation on all issues in Item No. 16.
8	Any further discussion?
9	Seeing none, all in favor, say aye.
10	(Chorus of ayes.)
11	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Any opposed?
12	By your action, you have approved the motion.
13	Thank you very much, staff.
14	(Agenda item concluded.)
