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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	COMMISSIONER BROWN: We are opening the 53
3	docket up at this time.
4	All right. Ms. DuVal, I think this is your
5	docket. Are there any preliminary matters to
6	address?
7	MS. DUVAL: Yes, Commissioner.
8	As in the other dockets, staff would like to
9	note that the Friday afternoon email was received
10	with proposed revisions to the draft prehearing
11	order from the parties, and staff will continue
12	working with the parties to ensure that the agreed
13	upon changes are incorporated in the final
14	prehearing order, and we will walk through those
15	issue numbers at the appropriate time.
16	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you.
17	Do any of the parties have any preliminary
18	matters other than the stipulations?
19	MS. PONDER: No.
20	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. So we are going to
21	go ahead through the draft prehearing order,
22	starting with Section I, Case Background, any
23	changes?
24	Seeing none, Section II, Conduct of
25	Proceedings. Any changes?

1	Seeing none, Section III, Jurisdiction. Any
2	changes?
3	Seeing none, Section IV, Procedure for
4	Handling Confidential Information.
5	MS. DUVAL: When confidential information is
6	used in the hearing, parties must have copies for
7	the Commissioners, necessary staff and the court
8	reporter in red envelopes clearly marked with the
9	nature of the contents. Any party wishing to
10	examine the confidential material that is not
11	subject to an order granting confidentiality shall
12	be provided a copy in the same fashion as provided
13	to the Commissioners subject to execution of any
14	appropriate protective agreement with the owner of
15	the material.
16	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. Section V,
17	Prefiled Testimony, Exhibits and Witnesses. Are
18	there any witnesses that, Mr. Munson, that you see
19	that can be stipulated in this docket?
20	MR. MUNSON: Yes. Again, Commissioner, we
21	will work to alert the parties. We hope to excuse
22	one or two witnesses. We will alert everybody in
23	short order.
24	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you.
25	OPC, can you excuse your witness?

1	MS. PONDER: Not at this time.
2	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you.
3	All right. We are moving on to Sections
4	pardon me, Ms. DuVal.
5	MS. DUVAL: Staff would suggest that witness
6	summaries be no longer than three minutes, as we
7	did in the other dockets, but if you would like to
8	take that under advisement.
9	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. We are going to go
10	ahead and do that. For the other dockets that we
11	have already made the ruling on, though, Ms.
12	Christensen, since you raised it, I guess we can go
13	back and look at it right, staff, is that
14	correct? Because in the 51 docket, we already
15	ruled on the three minutes.
16	MS. DUVAL: That's correct.
17	COMMISSIONER BROWN: So for 52 and 53, we can
18	look at it and issue a ruling in the final
19	prehearing order.
20	MS. DUVAL: Yes, ma'am.
21	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. So that's what we
22	are going to do based on OPC's concerns.
23	Section VI, Order of Witnesses. Anything you
24	would like to add here, Ms. DuVal?
25	MS. DUVAL: Only that staff will confirm with

1	each Commissioner that any identified witnesses can
2	be excused. If Commissioners don't have questions
3	of those witnesses, they may be excused from the
4	hearing and his or her testimony and exhibits will
5	be entered into the record as though read.
6	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you so much.
7	All right. Parties, any changes to the Basic
8	Positions under Section VII?
9	MR. MUNSON: No, Commissioner.
10	MS. PONDER: No, Commissioner.
11	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Great. Thank you.
12	Section VIII, Issues and Positions, Ms. DuVal.
13	MS. DUVAL: Staff notes that the order
14	establishing procedure requires that a party take a
15	position at the prehearing conference unless good
16	cause is shown as to why that party cannot take a
17	position at that time. And my understanding is
18	that, of the proposed stipulations that we received
19	on Friday, all parties were able to take a position
20	on all issues.
21	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. Could you do me a
22	favor, Ms. DuVal, and walk us through the Type 1
23	and Type 2 stipulations issue by issue in the 53
24	docket here?
25	MS. DUVAL: Yes.

1	For the 53 docket, it's staff's understanding
2	that the following issues are subject to a Type 1
3	stipulation: 1, 2, 4A, 5A, 9, 12, 13, 22 and 23.
4	And the following are subject to Type 2
5	stipulation: 3, 10, 11, 14, 15, 16 and 17. And
6	unless 6, 7, and 8 are also the same in this docket
7	as well, I will let the parties speak to that.
8	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Mr. Munson.
9	MR. MUNSON: That's correct. Again, we
10	anticipate circulating language in short order that
11	will allow us to stipulate to Issues 6, 7 I am
12	sorry, I think it's a different number in this
13	docket yeah, I am sorry, it is 6, 7 and 8.
14	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. All right. OPC
15	anything to odd?
16	MS. PONDER: No.
17	COMMISSIONER BROWN: All right. Moving on
18	oh, anything else to add, Ms. DuVal, under Issues
19	and Positions?
20	MS. DUVAL: No, nothing at this time, other
21	than staff will continue working towards getting
22	that finalized language in order.
23	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you.
24	Section IX, Exhibit List.
25	MS. DUVAL: Staff notes that it has prepared a

1	draft exhibit list that has been circulated to the
2	parties to determine if there are any objections,
3	and we will continue working towards finalizing
4	that list.
5	COMMISSIONER BROWN: All right. Moving on to
6	Section X, Proposed Stipulations, anything
7	additional to add?
8	MS. DUVAL: No, Commissioner.
9	COMMISSIONER BROWN: All right. Moving on to
10	Section XI, Pending Motions.
11	MS. DUVAL: There are no pending motions.
12	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Section XII, Pending
13	Confidentiality.
14	MS. DUVAL: There are no pending
15	confidentiality motions.
16	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you.
17	Section XIII, Post-Hearing Matters.
18	MS. DUVAL: If issues are stipulated and the
19	parties agree to waive briefs, the Commission may
20	make a bench decision for that portion of the
21	docket. If there are any issues to be briefed,
22	post-hearing briefs be no longer than 40 pages, and
23	due on December 28th, 2018.
24	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Are parties okay with all
25	of that?

1	MR. MUNSON: Yes, Commissioner.
2	MS. PONDER: Question, commission.
3	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you.
4	Sorry for the redundancy here, but it's record
5	for the record.
6	Moving on to Section XIV, Rulings. Staff.
7	MS. DUVAL: Staff recommends that the opening
8	statements, if any, should not exceed five minutes
9	per party unless any party chooses to waive its
10	opening statement.
11	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you.
12	All right. On to other matters. Are there
13	any other matters that the parties would like to
14	address in this prehearing conference?
15	MR. MUNSON: No, Commissioner.
16	COMMISSIONER BROWN: OPC, it looks like you
17	are conferring with counsel.
18	MS. CHRISTENSEN: We are fine.
19	COMMISSIONER BROWN: All right. Staff, any
20	other matters?
21	MS. DUVAL: Staff is not aware of any other
22	matters.
23	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. Seeing none, then
24	we are going to conclude the 53 docket and move on
25	to 54 docket, which is our final docket here today.
