I am writing this to urge you to reject the Gulf Power request for the storm related surcharge for a few reasons. First, Gulf Powers' proposal is for residential customers only. Why should we have to be the only ones affected by this proposal? Why aren't commercial, industrial, and government facilities included? The Gulf spokemans' statement that they will "also see bills increase by 3-8 percent depending on the rate plan." is very non-specific and not at all binding like the proposed surcharge is.

Next is the fact that Gulf Power is a public, for profit company. They want this rate increase so that their bottom line to their share holders is unaffected, which is understandable but hardly fair to the general customer.

Lastly, there is no end date specified. The statement that the surcharge will continue until "the final determined recoverable amount has been recovered through the surcharge, subject to final true-up adjustments." is nebulous at best and leaves the door wide open for abuse.

This is all I have to comment on and I want to thank you for allowing me this opportunity.
