FLORIDA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY'S REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION OF INFORMATION PROVIDED IN RESPONSE TO STAFF OF THE FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICE **COMMISSION'S TENTH SET OF INTERROGATORIES (NO. 100)**

Pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") requests confidential classification of certain information provided in response to the Staff of the Florida Public Service Commission's ("Staff") Tenth Set of Interrogatories (No. 100) ("Confidential Discovery Responses"). In support of its Request, FPL states as follows:

- 1. On July 19, 2019, Staff served its Tenth Set of Interrogatories (Nos. 97-108) and Fourth Request for Production of Documents (Nos. 17-18) on FPL. FPL's Response to Staff's Tenth Set of Interrogatories (No. 100) contains information of a confidential nature within the meaning of Section 366.093(3), Florida Statutes.
- 2. FPL served its responses to Staff's Tenth Set of Interrogatories (Nos. 97-108) and Fourth Request for Production of Documents (Nos. 17-18) on July 26, 2019. This request is being filed contemporaneously with the service of the responses to Staff's discovery in order to request confidential classification of the Confidential Discovery Responses consistent with Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code.
 - 3. The following exhibits are included with and made a part of this request:
- Exhibit A consists of a copy of the Confidential Discovery Responses on a. which all information that FPL asserts is entitled to confidential treatment is highlighted.

- b. Exhibit B consists of an edited version of the Confidential Discovery Responses on which all information that FPL asserts is entitled to confidential treatment is redacted.
- c. Exhibit C is a table containing a page-and-line identification of the information highlighted in Exhibit A and a brief description of the Confidential Information. Exhibit C also references the specific statutory bases for the claim of confidentiality and identifies the declarants who support the requested classification.
- d. Exhibit D contains the declaration of Thomas R. Koch in support of this Request.
- 4. FPL submits that the highlighted information in Exhibit A is proprietary confidential business information within the meaning of Section 366.093(3), Florida Statutes. This information is intended to be and is treated by FPL as private, and its confidentiality has been maintained. Pursuant to Section 366.093, such information is entitled to confidential treatment and is exempt from the disclosure provisions of the public records law. Thus, once the Commission determined that the information in question is proprietary confidential business information, the Commission is not required to engage in any further analysis or review such as weighing the harm of disclosure against the public interest in access to the information.
- 5. As the description included in Exhibit C and the declarations included in Exhibit D indicate, the Confidential Discovery Responses provided by FPL contain information concerning bids or other contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of the public utility or its affiliates to contract for goods or services on favorable terms. This information is protected by Section 366.093(3)(d), Fla. Stat.

6. Additionally, this information relates to the competitive interests of FPL's outside vendor. Disclosure of such information would impair the vendor's competitive interests and would be a contractual breach on the part of FPL. This information is protected by Section 366.093(3)(e), Fla. Stat.

7. Upon a finding by the Commission that the Confidential Information remains proprietary and confidential business information, the information should not be declassified for at least an additional eighteen (18) month period and should be returned to FPL as soon as it is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business. See § 366.093(4), Fla. Stat.

WHEREFORE, for the above and foregoing reasons, as more fully set forth in the supporting materials and affidavits included herewith, Florida Power & Light Company respectfully requests that its Request for Confidential Classification be granted.

DECLARATION OF THOMAS R. KOCH

- 1. My name is Thomas R. Koch. I am currently employed by Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") as Senior Manager of Demand-Side Management Strategy, Cost & Performance of FPL's Customer Service Business Unit. I have personal knowledge of the matters stated in this written declaration.
- 2. I have reviewed the document and information included in Exhibit A to FPL's Request for Confidential Classification filed this date, for which I am listed as the declarant on Exhibit C. The document that FPL seeks to have protected contains pricing information for work performed for FPL by outside consultants and attorneys, specifically Nexant, Inc. and the Radey and Gunster law firms. Disclosure of this pricing information would impair FPL's ability to contract for such services on favorable terms in the future and would be harmful to these vendors' competitive interests. FPL treats these documents as confidential and proprietary.
- 3. Consistent with the provisions of the Florida Administrative Code, such materials should remain confidential for a period of eighteen (18) months. In addition, they should be returned to FPL as soon as the information is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business so that FPL can continue to maintain the confidentiality of these documents.
