efficiency goals, many of the state's largest utilities have proposed goals of zero or close to zero. These proposals are unacceptable, and it is up to you to ensure that they do better. With Floridians like me bearing some of the highest electric bills in the nation, the utilities' proposed goals would lock in unnecessary and debilitatingly high energy bills for hard-working families.

That's why I'm asking you to please support Florida families by setting goals that are in line with the energy savings captured by leading states. A goal of 1% is too low--we can do better by investing in energy efficiency and renewable energy such as solar to get us off fossil fuels and save us all money.
