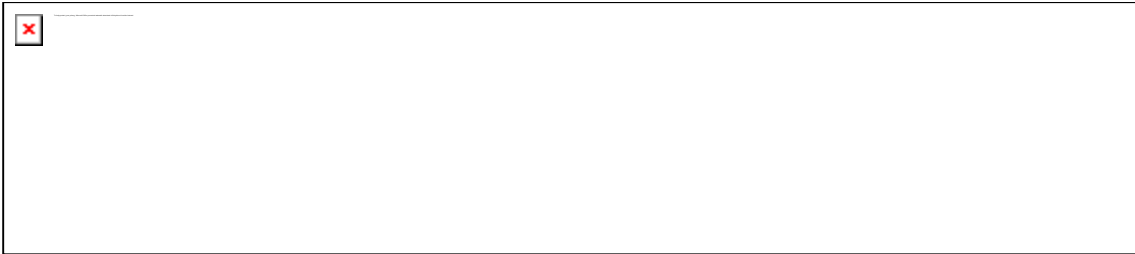

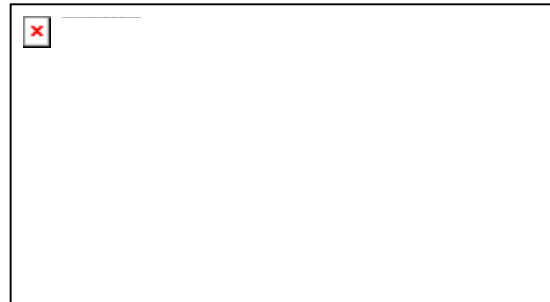

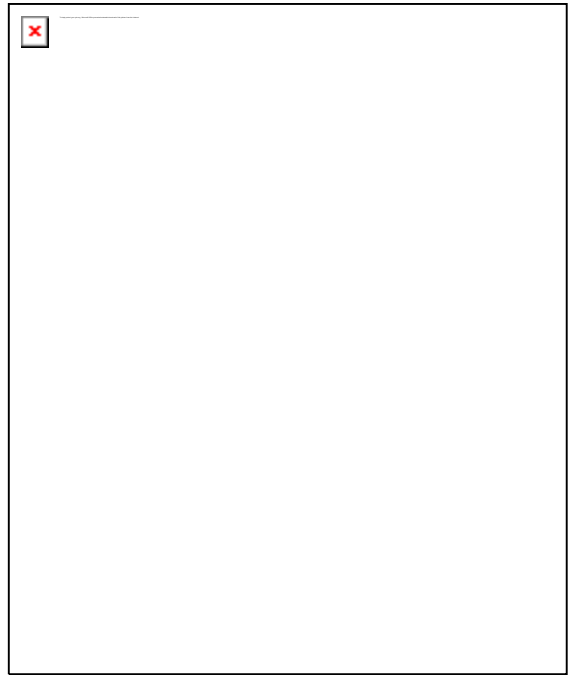


Short range weather forecasts are calling for slightly above normal warmth in the mid-Atlantic region but this isn't doing anything for prices. In fact, nothing seems to be impacting prices at the moment as we stay stuck in this narrow trading range. Even storage is having no effect at the moment. Early call for this Thursday's injection is for +60 BCF which is bearish when compared to the same week the previous year of + 35 BCF and the five year average of + 49 BCF but chances are slim that prices will move.



Hedge funds remained virtually unchanged week on week but are currently 72.5% net short which means that the winter contracts are in jeopardy of going higher.

No signals from a technical point of view so no direction here either. All in all another very quiet week.
