Alturas Utilities, LLC., (Alturas or Utility) is a Class C utility providing service in Polk County to approximately 48 residential customers and 7 general service customers. In 1997, Alturas was granted a certificate when Polk County turned over jurisdiction of privately-owned water and wastewater utilities to the Commission.¹ Alturas is operated under Florida Utility Services 1, LLC (FUS1), a service company. The utility's rates for water were last approved by the Commission in a staff-assisted rate case in 2016.² Subsequently, the rates were increased by two price index rate adjustments. According to Alturas's 2019 annual report, water service total gross revenues were \$23,880 and total operating expenses were \$28,893.

The limited alternative rate increase (LARI) process allows small water and wastewater utilities to petition the Commission for a rate increase of up to 20 percent under a streamlined process. The Commission's rule (25-30.457, Florida Administrative Code) requires the utility to identify the need for the rate increase and it provides protections to customers that ensure the utility's earnings do not exceed the range of its authorized rate of return. On May 28, 2020, Alturas filed an application for a LARI to recover from customers its share of increased common costs (such as office expense, salaries, and insurance) payable to its service company, FUS1. In addition, Alturas also seeks to recover its share of the costs for a new Compliance Technician position. The utility selected the test year ended December 31, 2019. In its application, pursuant to rule 25-30.457, F.A.C., the utility is requesting to apply a 13.60 percent increase to its existing rates.

These comments will be taken into consideration by the Commission in its decision regarding the proposed rate increase.

Sunrise Utilities, LLC (Sunrise or utility) is a Class C utility providing water service in Polk County to approximately 257 customers. The utility was granted a grandfather certificate in 1997. Sunrise is operated under Florida Utility Services 1, LLC (FUS1), a service company. The utility's rates for water were last approved in a staff-assisted rate case in 2016. Subsequently, the rates were increased by two price index rate adjustments and decreased by a rate reduction to remove fully amortized rate case expense. According to Sunrise's annual report, water service total gross revenues were \$62,000 and total operating expenses were \$75,966.

The limited alternative rate increase (LARI) process allows small water and wastewater utilities to petition the Commission for a rate increase of up to 20 percent under a streamlined process. The Commission's rule (25-30.457, Florida Administrative Code) requires the utility to identify the need for the rate increase and it provides protections to customers that ensure the utility's earnings do not exceed the range of its authorized rate of return. On May 28, 2020, Sunrise filed an application for a LARI to recover from customers its share of increased common costs (such as office expense, salaries, and insurance) payable to its service company, FUS1. In addition, Sunrise also seeks to recover its share of the costs for a new Compliance Technician position. In its application, the utility is requesting a 22.92 percent increase to its existing rates.
