Dear Commissioner Gary F. Clark,

I am hopeful that someone actually reads this versus just tallying it as another form letter sent without any real consideration. I've been through this before (although previously as more of a spectator than a concerned actor). I'm gonna' leave in a lot of the jargon below as some of it is pertinent although you very well should already be aware of it.

The middle of a public health and economic crisis is not the time to create more uncertainty by making changes to solar rights that will hurt jobs and take money out of people's pockets.

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I'm going to personalize this a bit. I am fully in support of net metering and a quid pro quo exchange regarding electricity up to the full annual consumption by a private source. That said, I'd need to see more information to go beyond that. I don't think that private solarization should be seen as a way to earn income but rather to provide diversity to the collection of energy by the system as a whole I saw this mess when I lived in Nevada. Fairness to me is a one for one exchange of KWh with the excess being reimbursed at the wholesale rate.

Where this gets tricky is that states/systems are prone to directly promising or strongly implying that there will be a retail recompense for overage. If that's the case, then you've painted yourselves into a bit of a corner in terms of fairness and equity. At the very least, if that is the case, you should consider a process of change over time to allow the people who are already into the system based on past promises to be treated fairly. You could set a change of policy date and grandfather in those already acting according to the current presumption. That's just a thought. Good luck.
