Dear Chairman Art Graham,

This is to request that your organization publish a history of “Cost of Generation” rates (COG-1) for all Florida Utilities from 2018 to the present. This would be very helpful to existing and future solar system owners. Finding information about COG-1 net metering rates is like looking for a needle in a haystack.

In 2019 energysage.com published an internet document that indicated that the COG-1 tariff rate for Duke Energy Florida was 6.310 cents/kWh.

On April 25, 2018 my 8,400 watt solar system was installed and operational. At the end of 2018, my solar system produced an annual excess energy of 1,051 kWh for which I received only a credit of \$34.32, at a COG-1 rate of 3.26546 cents/kWh.

At the end of 2019 my solar system produced an annual excess energy of 4,172 kWh for which I received only a credit of \$105.30, at a COG-1 rate of 2.52397 cents/kWh.

A recent Duke Energy publication entitled “Rates effective with June 2020 bills” indicates an Energy charge for the first 1,000 kWh of 8.290 cents per kWh and a Fuel charge for the first 1,000 kWh of 3.067 cents per kWh.

I wonder how my 2019 reimbursement cost, the Cost of Generation (COG-1), could be only 2.52397 cents per kWh when the fuel charge alone is 3.067 cents per kWh.

A table showing the historical COG-1 rates from 2018 to the present for all Florida utilities would be very helpful to compare COG-1 rates between all Florida utilities.

Thank you for providing this information for existing and future solar system owners.

As the Project Administrator for SEGSS III-VII at Kramer Junction and and Project Engineering Manager for SEGSS VIII and IX at Harper Dry Lake, I came to learn the relentless and often vicious resistance on the part of traditional energy companies to the introduction of alternative energy production. It is astonishing to me that the resistance has not abated and that regulatory agencies are seemingly powerless to affect a change.
