- 1. Please refer to Exhibit N, page 2 of 7, of the Utility's application,
  - a. The Utility stated other miscellaneous repairs would be outlined in detailed engineering reports, by system. Please provide the detailed engineering reports the Utility is referring to.
  - b. The Utility anticipates making improvements to meet electric code requirements. Please identify which systems are currently not meeting electric code requirements.
  - c. The Utility anticipates making improvements to the storage of liquid sodium hydrochloride. Please identify which systems currently do not have the safe storage of liquid sodium hydrochloride.

CSWR Response: a. Under separate cover and with a request for confidential classification, CSWR-Florida will file the requested Engineering Reports.

b. Please see the referenced Engineering Reports for necessary improvements identified to date. In addition, based on the due diligence completed by CSWR-Florida at this time, the company believes that all systems currently owned by Sunshine Utilities require a thorough review of electric code requirement compliance.

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c. Please see the referenced Engineering Reports for necessary improvements to chemical storage identified to date. In addition, based on the due diligence completed by CSWR-Florida at this time, the company believes that all systems currently owned by Sunshine Utilities require a thorough review of chemical storage regulatory compliance.

2. The Utility's July 20, 2021, filing regarding the Department of Environmental Protection's (DEP) secondary contaminants testing provided test results from 2018. Since the DEP tests for secondary contaminants once every three years, if there are more recent test results available, please provide them.

CSWR Response: CSWR-Florida has confirmed with the Seller that there are no more recent test results presently available from the DEP.
