COMPLAINT INFORMATION

Complaint: Other Complaint against Florida Power & Light Company

Details:

FPL is attempting to pass legislation that will reduce or eliminate net metering for solar customers in Florida. This is not right!

They currently have less than 1% of their customers sending excess energy from home-based solar generation to the grid they manage - a grid that taxpayers have helped subsidize over the past 100 years!

They claim losses of over 700 million dollars in the media (over a period of 7 years) to inflate the damage net metering is doing. They reported 18 billion dollars of revenue in 2020 (FPL and NextEra). Those losses are against potential lost revenue. That is a kin to Wal-mart reporting lost revenue for shoppers that chose Target, but we don't have a choice.

FPL owns the addresses in their portion of the grid and we don't get to shop - Solar is our only choice!

Removing net metering will eliminate tens of thousands of jobs in the renewable (solar) industry in Florida. There have been payments made by NextEra to the politicians looking to pass this bill. This is not right, not fair, not consistent with a free market society. Studies show that net metering doesn't negatively impact the management of a public grid until it reaches nearly 23% adoption - we are decades from this point. And, the US DOE has stated our common goal is to install solar on EVERY rooftop by 2050. This move by FPL is a direct violation of that goal and is self-serving. We lose billions in family income, millions in household savings, and years of hard work so that big energy companies can get richer. NO!
