NOTICE is hereby given that the staff of the Florida Public Service Commission (Commission) is seeking comment and information from utility customers pertaining to the petition of Country Walk Utilities, Inc. (Country Walk or Utility) for a limited alternative rate increase (LARI) in Highlands County.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Notice is to advise customers and other interested persons how they may provide comment to Commission staff regarding the quality of service the Utility provides and on the Utility's proposed increase in rates included in this notice. These comments will be taken into consideration by the Commission in its decision regarding the proposed rate increase.

BACKGROUND

Country Walk Utilities, Inc. (Country Walk or Utility) is a Class C utility providing water service to approximately 70 residential water customers and one general service water customer in Highlands County. The service area is located in Southwest Florida Water Management District. Wastewater treatment is provided by septic tank. Country Walk was granted Certificate No. 579-W in a transfer from Holmes Utilities, Inc. in Docket No. 20130294-WU. The Utility's rates for water were last approved by the Commission in a staff-assisted rate case in 2018. According to Country Walk's 2020 Annual Report, water service total gross revenues were \$58,820 and total operating expenses were \$32,246.

The LARI process allows small water and wastewater utilities to petition the Commission for a rate increase of up to 20 percent under a streamlined process. The Commission's rule (25-30.457, Florida Administrative Code) requires the utility to identify the need for the rate increase and it provides protections to customers that ensure the utility's earnings do not exceed the range of its authorized rate of return. On November 16, 2021, Country Walk filed an application for a LARI due to under earnings as a result of a decrease in revenues, increase in operating expenses, and an increase in Highlands County taxes. In its application, the Utility is requesting an 8.18 percent increase to its existing rates.

PROCEDURES AFTER RECEIVING COMMENTS

Commission staff will prepare a recommendation on the Utility's proposed rate increase which is tentatively scheduled to be submitted to the Commission on March 24, 2022. The Commission will then vote on staff's recommendation, taking into consideration customer comments, at its April 5, 2022 Commission Conference. As noted above, customers may address the Commission directly at this Conference. Customers may also watch the Commission Conference live from the PSC website at www.floridapsc.com. Look for the "Watch Live Broadcast" icon on the left side of the webpage.

The Commission will thereafter issue a proposed agency action (PAA) order containing rates which may be different from those contained in staff's final recommendation. Substantially affected persons have 21 days from the date that the PAA order is issued to protest the Commission's PAA order. Customers may obtain a copy of staff's recommendation and all documents filed in this docket under the Clerk's Office tab at the Commission's website (http://www.floridapsc.com).
