Dear Public Service Commission Members:

I am writing to request that you to update the Public Service Commission's policies on energy conservation. The PSC currently uses a flawed, outdated, and archaic method for determining the feasibility of conservation projects, leading to large amounts of wasted energy and higher bills for Florida consumers.

The "Rate Impact Measure" (RIM) test penalizes efficiency by treating it as a cost, due to reduced revenue for the utilities. Under such a test, conservation projects will never have a positive effect from the perspective of utility companies.

In addition, utilities state that efficiency projects should bring a payback to the customer in less than two years, which is a completely unreasonable standard that eliminates a whole range of the most cost-effective ways to help customers reduce energy use. This has led to conservation goals of zero or near zero being proposed by multiple utilities.

I ask that you update your energy conservation standards and require utilities to help customers save energy and lower their bills versus maintain the status quo.
