Ladies & Gentlemen,

This letter is to plead for Charlotte County PSC to deny the wastewater services application proposed by Environmental Services.

There is no need for your taxpayers to pay more OUTRAGEOUS fees for water services managed by Mr. Boyer. At present our bill is in excess of \$300! (*The home has been uninhabitable due to lan damages and there is only sparce use of any water*)

The barrier island long term plan may be to invest in sewer services BUT IT NEEDS TO BE COUNTY RUN not a private company with undiscovered political interests. Your taxpayers have been surcharged enough! The county would be better off building a bridge back to the barrier islands.

Environmental Utilities proposes only the removal of liquid not solid waste. Taxpayers would be required to pay more inflated charges and yet still must continue to use septic systems already in place. This makes no sense.

There is no evidence of public health or safety issues associated with the present site specific septic systems already in place.
