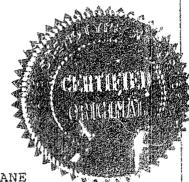

MR. KEENER: Just for purposes of the record, we will agree or at least agree for the same stipulations that we had in the previous deposition. However, the one deposition that we didn't agree to that the purpose of this deposition is being taken for discovery purposes only, Southern Bell asserts that that is what the deposition is for.

MR. BECK: And, again, like last time, Barlow, I'll assert that it is taken pursuant to the Florida Rules of Civil Procedure, period, whatever that implies.

- Q Okay. And, specifically, if you could refer to the section under miscellaneous, under security?
  - A Uh-huh.
- Q About halfway down in that paragraph it states that,
  "Terry Lane also stated that South Contral Bell does not feel
  Caller ID will reduce annoying call problems." Do you see that
  there?

Q And you thought that if it were advertised as a way to stop harassing calls that people would feel you wouldn't need as many people in the Annoyance Call Center?

that I wanted to be sure that a customer didn't think that if he subscribed to Caller ID, then he could then contact the Annoyance Call Center to obtain some additional help and resolution of his problem. For instance, if he got a harassing call, and he was a Caller ID problem, that was my corcern about the advertising, that I wanted to be sure that the customer understood, you know, what he was getting.

Q Okay. So, you didn't want customers of Caller ID to be calling the Annoyance Call Center, is that generally it?

A I didn't have any problem with them calling the Annoyance Call Center and getting the help that they could get from the Annoyance Call Center. I didn't want them to call the Annoyance Call Center thinking that, "Hey, I got a harassing call. And here is the telephone number, you take care of it," that was my concern.

O Down on the same paragraph, a little further, it states that, "Terry Lane requested that Caller ID not be promoted as a way to stop narassing calls," do you see that?

A Yes, sir.

1 Q Is that accurate?

- A That's accurate to the degree I just explained to you. That was my point during the meeting.
- Q Okay. Did South Central Bell promote Caller ID as a way to stop harassing calls?
- A Not to my knowledge. I was concerned that it might get to that, because of the fact that Caller ID was commented about as being a way to discourage annoying calls in the general public.
- Q And you don't feel the advertisings by South Cent al Bell conveys that message to customers, that if you get Caller ID, harassing calls will be diminished?
- A Say that again. I'm sorry.
- Q Okay. You don't thin! the Caller ID advertising by South Central Bell conveys the message that Caller ID will help diminish harassing calls?
- A To be honest, I am not sure what the advertising says about Caller ID. It's certainly my opinion, though, that I think Caller ID will discourage people from making certain types of harassing calls. But I am not in the Marketing Department or the Advertising Department, so I am not familiar with exactly what they say.
- Q In which South Central states is Caller ID available now?
  - A Tennessee, Tennessee only.

- 1 Q How long has it been available there?
  - A I believe it was first deployed in like November of '39, if I am not mistaken. I think that's correct.
  - Q What has been the effect of Caller ID in the Annoyance Call Center serving Tennessee?
  - A I don't know. I can't -- I don't have any basis to determine the effect on it.
    - Q Why is that?

- South Central Bell. It is centralized in Birmingham, Alabara, and it handles customers from all five states. And the way the customers contact the Annoyance Call Center, and the calls come into the Annoyance Call Center, they are counted through a call distributor machine. But they are not broken down. It can't break them down as to what area those calls are coming from. So, we don't know that there is a certain number from Kentucky and a certain number from Tennessee. We just know that we have got this many calls coming into the Bureau.
- O Okay. And has South Central Eell taken any steps to try to isolate the effect of Caller ID then? I gather the answer is no, but I wanted to check with you.
  - A Not that I am aware of.
  - MR. BECK: That is all I have. Thank you. There may be some others.
    - MS. GREEN: No.

### Sales Report

(August is the latest available sales report).

Natchez slipped slightly in August sales.

The Tennessee SOTAs had a slight increase and Memphis too

had an increase to 9.83% customer penetration.

Louisiana rigures were unavailable.

# Advertising

Advertising will have the same program as currently scheduled in Memphis.

Caller ID will be advertised with the other TouchStar features when over 50% of the lines are CID capable.

Security made a request to review the Caller ID advertising before it runs in the media.

There is a recommended 60-day service order waiver as eac.. metro CO cuts. This will be a state decision.

### RightTouch

At the SBT October Implementation meeting, the BSS RightTouch representative stated that RightTouch will have a TouchStar information line that will refer a customer to a sales channel after it has given information. due 401989. Plans are being made to include TouchStar in RightTouch's ability to order a service - as has just begun with Custom Calling Service. (A customer can suspend or restore a line, or order - CCS by using a Touchtone phone without talking to a rep. It is an interactive system with 24 hour a day accessibility.)

### Caller ID

Tennessee has completed their stakeholder effort and has filed their Caller ID tariff. At this time there has been no intervention.

Tennessee Customer Service Reps will be trained after the tariff effective date. The sale date will probably be 2

weeks after that effective date.

### Deployment by State

Kentucky - The deployment schedule is the same. is scheduled 2091. Westport and Crestview will not be included. Kentucky has not decided on how they will sell TouchStar. They will be equipped for Caller ID.

Louisiana - The Louisiana schedule brings 7 locations up from 9/1/91 until 12/31/91 beginning with New Orleans. They include New Orleans, Baton Rouge, Shreveport, Monroe, Lafayette, Lake Charles, and Alexandria. They will try to move up generic updates. All features, including Caller ID will be ready at deployment.

Mississippi - Jackson and the Gulfcoast are still expected to be deployed 4091. They will cut with all features, including Caller ID. Natchez has been upgraded to generic 10, but is being sold as generic 9. It is not a 2 LHE. The procedures are in the field for generic 10, and George Grier will check into the announcements to see if thee are differences. Mississippi asked if a new TouchStar tariff would become effective as the Natchez trial tariff expired on 11/90.

Tennessee - Deployments are on schedule. Memphis will be the first Caller ID site. SLC issues may exclude some Memphis COs from Caller ID. All the lAs are equipped with The digital offices Caller ID as are and 2 5ESS offices. will bring up the non-list features in January or February.

Caller ID in the SOTAs will be brought up as soon as they can. Tennessee is still reviewing and checking the inventory.

Alabama - Birmingham is on schedule for 16/1/90. The digital switches will have the non-list features plus Caller ID. (The lA switches will, of course, have all a features, plus Caller ID.) The digital switches will be equipped with Phase II no later than 1 year after the phase I deployment. This is being done because network did not want to "piggyback" the work. By the end of 1992 Phase II will be in all metro areas deployed.

Montgomery is due 4/1/91, Huntsville 1092, and Tuscaloosa 20912.

### Miscellaneous:

### Security

A request was made at an earlier Caller ID meeting that questions related to Caller ID number identification not be directed to the ACB. However, they are investigation questions such as shall they give published names to a customer with a CID number. Terry Lane also stated the SCB dee not feel Caller ID will reduce annoying call problems. There has been no substantial reduction in load with Call Tracing. When the market is highly penetrated with Call Tracing and Caller ID, there may be a reduction. Terry Lane requested that CID not be promoted as a way to stop harassing calls. Mick Chlon agreed and said all ads would show positive benefits of who is calling.
