Dear Mr. Shirah:

This is in response to your letter of July 31, 1989 (enclosed) regarding deficiencies at the subject public drinking water system.

The department is in sympathy with you concerning your dilemma. However, as noted in previous correspondence with you, most of these deficiencies have been chronic problems since 1982. We have been delegated the task of enforcing the Florida Administrative Code to insure that public water supply systems meet the minimum Safe Drinking Water Act requirements and to do otherwise would make us derelict of our responsibilities.

Following are comments on your response in your letter as enumerated:

- 1. We will wait for the satisfactory results.
- 2. Same comment as Item #1.
- 3. Same comment as Item #1.
- 4. During the sanitary survey of June 21, 1989, wastewater plumbing from several houses was noted to be located within a 100-foot radius of the well. The department will accept the present distance between the subject well and the aforementioned wastewater plumbing. However, if in the future the well and/or water system are shown to be contaminated either chemically or bacteriologically in violation of Chapter 17-550 of the Florida Administrative Code, the department will reevaluate the situation and will require corrective measures be undertaken.
- 5. Noted.

- 7. The failure to provide a metering device was noted (as long ago as 1982) in the sanitary survey letter to you dated April 16, 1982 (copy enclosed) and was questioned due to the incomplete monthly operation reports (MORs).
- 8. A DPD test kit must be on-site for daily check of chlorine residual.
- 9. Modifying your method of chlorine treatment from the originally approved hypochlorinator to gas chlorine without department approval and a valid permit was a violation.
- Regrettably, your response concerning installation of auxiliary power is not acceptable to the department. We consider installation of auxiliary power (with automatic start-up) to be very important at this water system. The code has always been very clear about this. In order to expedite the installation, the department will not require construction drawings for installing the auxiliary power equipment. Instead, the department will accept an application with a professional engineer's descriptive proposal for the auxiliary power (with automatic start-up) including equipment specifications. The engineer's descriptive proposal must be submitted by September 20, 1989 and the completion of installation by December 1, 1989.

 - 14. Site visits of the operator must conform with the code requirements.
- Concerning the old well, this was also mentioned in the sanitary survey letter to you dated April 16, 1982. This well must either be operational or properly abandoned after obtaining an abandonment permit from the water management district.

In addition to the above deficiencies, a review of your MORs indicates the operator visits your plant three (3) days a week instead of the required five (5) visits per week and one (1) weekend visit.
