(Hearing convened at 10:35 a.m.)

COMMISSIONER EASLEY: We'll call the hearing to order. Mr. Elias, would you read the notice, please.

MR. ELIAS: Notice issued by the Clerk's Office advising that a public hearing will be held in Docket 910220-GU, "Notice of Change of Ownership of Assets of Miller Gas Company by City Gas Company of Florida," and advises that a public hearing will be held on 10:30 a.m. on May 16th, 1991, at the Holiday Inn at 1350 South Dixie Highway, Coral Gables, Florida. The notice advises that the hearing will commence at 10:30 a.m. and that customers who wish to present testimony are urged to appear promptly at the beginning of the hearing since the hearing may be adjourned early if no witnesses are present to testify.

COMMISSIONER EASLEY: Thank you. We'll take appearances of counsel, please.

MR. BEASLEY: Commissioner, I'm James D.

Beasley, with the law firm of Ausley, McMullen,

McGehee, Carothers and Proctor, Post Office Box 391,

Tallahassee, Florida 32302, representing City Gas

Company of Florida.

COMMISSIONER EASLEY: Thank you.

1	MR. ELIAS: I'm Robert V. Elias, 101 East
2	Gaines Street, on behalf of the Commission Staff.
3	COMMISSIONER EASLEY: Thank you. And I'm
4	Commissioner Betty Easley. I am the panel for today.
5	This will be an opportunity for public
6	comment. The technical part of the hearing and the
7	final agenda will be held June 11th in Tallahassee,
8	with the order to be issued on July 1st.
9	We have a fairly formal proceeding even
10	though it is a public hearing. In order for any public
11	witnesses' comments to be placed in the official
12	record, it is necessary for us to have a court reporter
13	and it is necessary for us to swear witnesses in.
14	I understand we have one public witness, is
15	that the case?
16	MR. BEASLEY: That's correct.
17	COMMISSIONER EASLEY: All right. Sir, if you
18	would, I'll ask you to come to the podium, and swear
19	you in and then you can make your statement. I
20	understand the company, by the way, has waived making
21	an opening statement, is that correct, Mr. Beasley?
22	MR. BEASLEY: That's correct, Commissioner.
23	I would like to offer into the record of this
24	proceeding an affidavit of Mr. Wutzler regarding a
25	separate notice that was sent out to all former Miller

Gas customers, if I might. And I will do that after 1 2 Mr. Ready's comments. COMMISSIONER EASLEY: All right, sir. 3 (Witness sworn.) COMMISSIONER EASLEY: Would you state your 5 6 name and address for the record? WITNESS READY: My name is Robert C. Ready, 7 15400 Southwest 85th Avenue, Miami, Florida. I am the 8 Assistant Director for Operations and Maintenance of 9 the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Authority Department. 10 COMMISSIONER EASLEY: Thank you, sir. Go 11 right ahead and make any comment you care to make. 12 WITNESS READY: We are one of the large 13 customers of Miller Gas Company. We use the gas in our lime recalfining facility at the Alexander Orr Water 15 Treatment Plant in South Dade County. 16 What we do is we take calcium carbonate 17 sludge from the water which is produced in the 18 treatment process. We put it through a gas-fueled lime 19 kiln and that converts it to calcium oxide, which 20 chemical is used in the treatment of water. We are, in 21 other words, recycling the lime. We use a large 22 quantity of gas, and the proposed rate change, based on 23

the quantity of gas we use, would cost us approximately

\$6,000 per month. Our expenses are covered by our

water rates. And our water rates have already been set for the current fiscal year based on the existing gas rates.

So we presented this problem and met with Mr. Langer of City Gas, and discussed it with him, and reached an understanding, as I see it, that it would be acceptable to us -- and we would consider it fair -- if the change in the gas rates and the conversion to a contract that would be the same as another contract that we have already negotiated for our other lime kiln in Hialeah, would take effect February 1st, 1992. That would be acceptable to the Water and Sewer Department, and I believe acceptable to City Gas. And it would avoid difficulties with the current budget and would also ameliorate the impact of the change and expenses on our rates for the coming fiscal year. That I think would be a reasonable approach. So we wrote a letter to City Gas Company stating that, and may I present the letter?

COMMISSIONER EASLEY: Yes, please.
(Hands document to Commissioner.)

COMMISSIONER EASLEY: While you're doing

that, what is your fiscal year, Mr. Ready?

WITNESS READY: It ends September 30th,

COMMISSIONER EASLEY: Thank you. All right.



Re: Natural Gas Rates

Dear Mr. Langer:

This will confirm our earlier discussions about City Gas' large volume interruptible rate IL, and its applicability to our operations. The Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Authority Department (WASAD) operates the Alexander Orr, Jr. Water Treatment Plant in Dade County, which formerly obtained its natural gas supply from Miller Gas before City Gas acquired the system. The Board of County Commissioners of Dade County recently approved a contract for natural gas service at City Gas' IL rate for another water treatment plant operated by WASAD in Hialeah.

WASAD has reviewed City Gas' request that the Florida Public Service Commission (FPSC) authorize City Gas to apply its regular rates and charges in a uniform manner to customers formerly served by Miller Gas, and to apply its IL rate to the Alexander Orr, Jr. Water Treatment Plant. This would increase WASAD's cost for gas by approximately \$6,000 per month. WASAD's rates to its water customers are determined by its costs and these rates are fixed for the current budget year. The budget and rates for next year are currently being prepared.

WASAD requests that the proposed change be postponed to February 1, 1992 to ameliorate the impact on water rates. Based on our meeting of April 25, 1991 it is our understanding that this proposal is mutually acceptable, subject to Public Service Commission approval and that the current contract for gas service to the Alexander Orr, Jr. Water Treatment Plant will be changed at that time to be similar to our contract for the Hialeah Water Treatment Plant.

On February 19, 1991, City Gas Company of Florida ("City Gas") acquired the natural gas assets and service areas of Miller Gas Company ("Miller"). City Gas notified the Florida Public Service Commission ("FPSC") of the change in ownership on February 25, 1991, and also petitioned the FPSC for authority to apply City Gas' rates and charges and other tariff provisions regarding the terms and conditions of natural gas service in its future dealings with the former Miller Gas customers.

City Gas stated in its Petition that the rates and charges of City Gas and the former rates of Miller Gas were very similar. Miller Gas had received FPSC approval to file a request for a rate increase at the time City Gas acquired Miller Gas' natural gas operations. (Docket No. 900900-GU).

On April 2, 1991, the FPSC voted to approve City Gas' Petition on an interim basis with respect to all bills for meter readings taken on and after May 2, 1991.

Set forth below are the FPSC approved rates and charges for City Gas compared with the rates and charges last approved by the FPSC for Miller Gas customers, before tayes:

The ECCR charge allows residential customers to participate in City Gas' conservation programs at a cost of approximately 4 cents a day (using the currently approved cost recovery factor).

On June 11, 1991, at its regularly scheduled Agenda Conference commencing at 9:30 a.m. in Room 106 of the Fletcher Building, 101 East Gaines Street, Tallahassee, Florida, 32399-0870, the FPSC will consider granting permanent approval of the application of City Gas' rates and charges for calculating bills of former Miller Gas customers. Any person whose substantial interests are affected by such permanent approval may file a petition for a formal proceeding, as provided for in Rule 25-22.036(4), Fla. Admin. Code, in the form provided by Rule 25-22.036 (7) (a) (d) (e), Fla. Admin. Code. This petition must be received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, at his office at 101 East Gaines Street, Tallahassee, Florida, 32399-9870, by the close of business on May 2, 1991. In the absence of such a petition, the action to be taken by the Commission at its June 11, 1991, Agenda Conference in this matter will be final agency action as of the date of issuance of the order commemorating such action.
