Issue 1: Recommendation that ATT-C's filing to implement a \$.75 surcharge on certain operator-assisted calls, where the user has the capability to dial but requests that the operator perform this service, be approved.

APPROVED with the modification, agreed to by ATHT, that ATHT'S operators are to inform customers requesting operator assistance of the amount of this surcharge and that it would be less expensive for the customer to dial the number themself. This requirement is to extend for 16 months.

The Commission also directed that Aos tariff filings incorporating similar surcharges may be approved administratively by staff if they include this 16 month notification requirement. See note on second page.

Alternative Recommendation: ATT-C's filing should be denied.
