ORDER APPROVING TARIFF

BY THE COMMISSION:

On July 18, 1991, United Telephone Company of Florida (United or the Company) filed a tariff introducing TeleSaver Service, an intraLATA discount toll service. This filing is comparable to two previously approved plans, GTE Florida Incorporated's Suncoast Preferred Service and Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company's Saver Service. Like Southern Bell's Saver Service, United's TeleSaver Service is designed for both residential and business customers. The business service is further broken down into three categories based on minimum hours of usage, with a charge for each additional minute of usage. Also like Southern Bell, United has established rate bands within which it can adjust the rates on a 30 day notice period. United is proposing that rates initially be set at the top of its bands, making its business service rates identical to Saver Service rates and its residential rates somewhat lower than Saver Service. The rates and band structures proposed by United are as follows:

We believe that United's tariff filing is appropriate. The Company maintains that it is offering this service to respond to the needs of its high volume users. We have previously approved similar offerings by other local exchange companies. Additionally, the proposed minimum rate level for each service covers the respective cost of the service. Accordingly, we approve the tariff as filed.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that United Telephone Company of Florida's tariff filing offering TeleSaver Service is hereby approved, effective September 16, 1991. It is further

ORDERED that if a protest is filed in accordance with the requirement set forth below, the tariff shall remain in effect with any increase in revenues held subject to refund pending resolution of the protest. It is further

ORDERED that if no protest is filed in accordance with the requirement set forth below, this docket shall be closed.

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**NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.59(4), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

The Commission's decision on this tariff is interim in nature and will become final, unless a person whose substantial interests are affected by the action proposed files a petition for a formal proceeding, as provided by Rule 25-22.036(4), Florida Administrative Code, in the form provided by Rule 25-22.036(7)(a)(d) and (e), Florida Administrative Code. This petition must be received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting at his office at 101 East Gaines Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0870, by the close of business on 10/29/91

In the absence of such a petition, this Order shall become final on the day subsequent to the above date.

Any objection or protest filed in this docket before the issuance date of this Order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.

If this Order becomes final on the date described above, any party adversely affected may request judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or by the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water or sewer utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days of the date this Order becomes final, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
