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

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



Enclosed you will find an excerpt from the June 24, 1993 Foster Report, which article discusses the three protests by United Gas Pipeline, Gateway Pipeline Company, and Florida Gas Transmission Company to the SITCO filing the FERC dated May 27, 1993. I think that the allegations made by United and Gateway should be of some interest to the Public Service Commission.

I particularly call your attention to the following passage from the Foster Report:

Gateway urged FERC to reject SITCO's filings as premature and without foundation. Gateway stated it had not been approached by SITCO to discuss a proposed interconnection. Consequently, Gateway declared, "to require a pipeline to be interconnected with major interstate pipeline system without that pipeline's consent would raise serious issues about a pipeline's integrity and ability to control its own operations, thereby undermining the level of security required by owners and customers."

As you probably recall, we called into question the paucity of information provided by SunShine concerning the availability of upstream pipeline capacity. Instead of asking for more concrete information from the applicant, the PSC staff just glossed over this glaring deficiency and instead blithely accepted SunShine's conclusory representations that such upstream connection was, in fact, available to SunShine and SITCO. Obviously, it is not, and the PSC has been duped. The United/Gateway systems, after all,

were allegedly to be the primary upstream connections of SunShine/SITCO.

I think that this a new "fact" that ought to be brought to the attention of the Commissioners prior to the entry of a final order. Otherwise, that final order will be predicated, at least in part, on what can only be described as a misrepresentation which, intentional or not, is still a misrepresentation of the true underlying facts.

I am attempting to obtain a copy of both United's and Gateway's filings with FERC and, upon receipt will forward a copy to you. In the interim, if I can be of any further assistance, please do not hesitate to give me a call.

The interstate, upstream portion of the SunShine project will include 143 miles of 30-inch mainline; 27 miles of pipeline lateral facilities to enable delivery of gas to four customers in the Pensacola area of Escambia County, Florida; an 8,000 horsepower compressor station located in Mobile County, Alabama; and eight meter stations. The eight meter stations will be located at interconnections with Chandeleur Pipeline Co. at Pascagoula, Mobile Bay Pipeline and Gateway Pipeline in Mobile County, Alabama, and SunShine Pipeline in Oklaloosa County, and at four delivery points on the Pensacola lateral. The estimated cost of the facilities is approximately \$197 million, which includes the cost of adding a 4,000 horsepower compressor at the Gateway Compressor Station to be in service for operation during 1999.

SITCO's application indicated total volume commitments of 716,000 MMBtu/d, including 291,700 MMBtu/d covered by executed precedent agreements, 347,000 MMBtu/d covered by letters of intent, and 77,300 MMBtu/d covered by verbal agreements. SITCO intends to conduct an open season for the initial allocation of capacity.

SITCO -- a project-financed pipeline -- proposed to develop a levelized rate over a 25-year period in order to mitigate front-end impacts. The application showed a 100% load factor levelized rate of 14.80¢. (See REPORT NO. 1929, pp15-16.)

United, who first jointly with ANR Pipeline Co. and then by itself is promoting a Florida pipeline venture called the SunCoast Pipeline project, charged that SITCO will be constructed through areas and markets which are already served in part by United. SITCO's proposal, United complained, appears to do nothing more than duplicate existing facilities and those facilities (i.e. Florida Gas Transmission Co.'s Phase III project) which are currently being considered by the Commission, and "appears to be designed to take gas and markets away from United."

United challenged SITCO claims to have project commitments totalling 716,000 MMBtu/d. Three of the committing customers currently are under contract for transportation capacity on United's system. "This duplication of expensive facilities only results in waste and inefficiencies," United declared. United also claimed its Order No. 636 transportation rates from Pascagoula to Pensacola, including Mobile Bay, are at least 1¢/MMBtu lower than SITCO's.

SITCO's market data was similarly questioned by Gateway Pipeline Co., which is operated by United and extends from an interconnection with United in Mobile County, Alabama to the Mobil Oil Exploration and Producing Southeast, Inc. plant and gas treatment plants operated by Shell Offshore, Inc. and Exxon Corp. in Mobile County. Gateway urged FERC to reject SITCO's filings as premature and without foundation. Gateway stated it had not been approached by SITCO to discuss a proposed interconnection. Consequently, Gateway declared, "to require a pipeline to be interconnected with a major interstate pipeline system without that pipeline's consent would raise serious issues about a pipeline's integrity and ability to control its own operations, thereby undermining the level of security required by owners and customers."

FGT, referring to its own Phase III expansion, told the Commission that, to insure a level playing field, standards applicable to FGT must be applied as well to this new pipeline bringing interstate gas to the state. "Two pipelines constructing facilities into the same geographical area to serve customers with interstate gas should be subject to the same regulatory standards," FGT stated.

As of 11/1/91, there is pending before FERC an application by FGT (CP92-182) for authority to expand its pipeline system capacity — the "Phase III" Expansion — by an annual average of 532,000 MMBtu/d for an estimated cost of \$900,000. FERC has issued a preliminary determination generally approving nonenvironmental aspects of the plan. (See REPORT NO. 1910, pp40-43; 1919, pp14-16.) FGT has also completed an open season for a future "Phase IV" system expansion.

Accordingly, FGT requested FERC to reject the SunShine partners' "attempt to limit the Commission's review to but a portion of a comprehensive interstate transmission system that is to extend from Pascagoula to peninsular Florida." If FERC permits its review to be limited this way, FGT argued, "this would expand the regulatory options available to new pipeline construction serving interstate markets."

FGT claimed Coastal, Florida Power and TransCanada "are not merely proposing to construct a new interstate line to connect with an existing Hinshaw line, nor is SunShine Pipeline to be merely a local distribution system rightly left to state regulation." Rather, FGT stated, "this bifurcated interstate transmission system is to be entirely new, will be constructed simultaneously by the same sponsors, and obviously has been designed to circumvent FERC's jurisdiction over the interstate transmission of gas."

Given the sponsors' own admission at times that the SITCO/SunShine pipelines continue a single integrated transmission system, FGT argued that the same regulatory standards should apply to each segment. Otherwise, compared to FGT's system which is subject to all FERC directives including Order Nos. 636 and 497, the SITCO/SunShine pipelines' "piecemeal" approach to certification would exempt the market end of the transmission system from these standards.

Some advantages of the segmented approach perceived by the SunShine sponsors, FGT commented, include their avoidance of concerns about application of Order No. 636, the imposition of an "at risk" condition and the Commission's Part 284 standards. Compared to FGT's Phase III expansion project, SITCO also could reap undue environmental advantage. Application of FERC's conditioning authority, FGT argued, would ensure that both lines are properly sited in the most environmentally efficacious manner.

Finally, FGT contended that SITCO's filing is deficient with respect to market, environmental and rate data.

COLUMBIA LNG SAYS BIDS JUSTIFY PROJECT

Columbia LNG Corp. recently confirmed it received sufficient bids from prospective customers during an open season for the period 5/24/93-6/2/93 to allow the company to proceed with plans to initiate new peaking, terminalling and transportation services at its "mothballed" liquefied natural gas receiving terminal located on the Chesapeake Bay near Cove Point, Maryland. Columbia LNG projects a timetable for the new services to begin early in 1995, but implementation is subject to receiving necessary governmental approvals and permits.

Columbia LNG President Michael Bridges said the company will begin finalizing precedent agreements with customers for the new services immediately. The company expects to file in mid-July necessary amendments to the application now pending before FERC.

The Columbia Gas System, Inc. owns 90.8% of Columbia LNG Corp. and Shell LNG Co., a subsidiary of Shell Oil Co., owns the remainder.

The open season was Columbia LNG's second. Columbia LNG (CP93-226) notified FERC on 5/19/93 that it failed to attract enough bids during the first open season for a proposed peaking service to be provided by using its LNG terminal near Cove Point. Based on follow-up discussions with bldders and other potential customers, Columbia LNG indicated it would modify the initial proposal and offer additional peaking options. Specifically, Columbia LNG offered to odd two new peaking services -- a five-day and a three-day service -- that would complement the ten-day peaking

shippers from its own funds (as Tejas proposed) when shippers' actions or events beyond Natural's control result in the need to declare a "critical time." However, the Commission added, Natural must provide reasonable backup for any claimed "out-of-pocket" costs. FERC also suggested that the question of whether all "complying" shippers should be treated the same for purposes of compensation should be addressed in the review sessions scheduled to occur after Natural and its customers obtain experience operating under Order Mo. 636.

Incentives Research

All commenters other than Tejas supported the settlement offer, although some requested modifications or clarifications. The Commission granted a few relatively minor modifications (such as requiring Natural to allow intra-day nomination changes as soon as it announces that a "critical time" is imminent, to act in a nondiscriminatory manner in arranging payments from the penalty compensation pool, to provide adequate backup for any claimed "out-of-pocket" costs, and to draft tariff language regarding its ability to change a receipt point in specific instances where it believes confirmed volumes will not be physically delivered). Otherwise, the Commission denied all requests for change.

For example, FERC rejected the Indicated Shippers' request for a 5% tolerance before assessment of a "critical time" scheduling charge, citing Natural's response that allowing a significant cost-free tolerance for "critical time" actions adverse to the system would undermine efforts of the company and other shippers to restore normal operating conditions. Also, as Natural pointed out, a shipper with access to electronic measurement can avoid a scheduling charge by making an intra-day nomination change. In addition, the Commission declined to adopt a "no-harm, no-foul" rule for assessing scheduling charges and penalties, noting that the purpose of penalties is to inhibit abusive behavior by shippers. Finally, FERC dismissed a request to require an in-kind makeup period for imbalances for the reason that this could delay resolution of monthly imbalances created by shippers and lead to increasingly larger balances being carried on pipelines' books.

COMPETING FLORIDA PIPELINES PROTEST SITCO APPLICATION FOR CONSTRUCTION CERTIFICATE

At least three pipeline companies -- United Gas Pipeline Co., Florida Gas Transmission Co. and Gateway Pipeline Co. -- recently told FERC that a filing on 5/27/93 by SunShine Interstate Transmission Co. (CP93-361) SITCO for review of only a portion of pipeline -- extending from Pascagoula, Mississippi to delivery points in Escambia and Oklaloosa Counties, Florida -- that the sponsors plan to construct is a ploy to sidestep FERC rules and to convey advantages to SunShine that are not accorded other pipelines serving the Florida market.

The 170-mile interstate segment for which the SunShine partners¹ seek Section 7(c) certificate authority to build will interconnect in Oklaloosa County with SunShine Pipeline Co.², a new 502-mile intrastate pipeline that may be built eastward and then south through most of central Florida, ultimately terminating in Polk County. Earlier this month the Florida Public Service Commission issued a preliminary approval for the Florida segment that is slated initially to deliver 250,000 dth/d, commencing in 1995. (See REPORT NO. 1918, p33.)

The three general partners are ANR Southern Pipeline Co., a subsidiary of The Coastal Corp.; Power Interstate Energy Services Corp., a subsidiary of Florida Power Corp.; and TCPL SunShine Interstate Ltd., an indirect subsidiary of TransCanada PipeLines Ltd.

² The intrastate pipeline is sponsored by the SunShine Pipeline Partners who include Coastal Southern Pipeline Co., a subsidiary of Coastal which shares officers with ANR Southern; TCPL SunShine Ltd., a subsidiary of TransCanada which shares officers with TCPL Interstate; and Power Energy Services Corp., which is another subsidiary of Florida Power Co.

PROTEST AND MOTION TO INTERVENE OF GATEWAY PIPELINE COMPANY

Pursuant to Rules 211 and 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 18 C.F.R. 385.211, 385.214, Gateway Pipeline Company ("Gateway") hereby protests and moves to intervene in the above-referenced docket. In support thereof, Gateway states as follows:

I.

INTERVENING PARTY

Gateway transports gas in interstate commerce and is a "natural gas company" within the meaning of the Natural Gas Act (NGA). Gateway's principal place of business is located at 600 Travis Street, Houston, Texas 77002. Gateway is operated by United Gas Pipe Line Company ("United"), and extends from an interconnection with United in Mobile County, Alabama to the Mobil Oil Exploration and Producing Southeast, Inc. plant and the gas treatment plants of Shell Offshore, Inc. and Exxon Corporation, also in Mobile County, Alabama. Gateway provides transportation of natural gas from the Mobile Bay area to the interconnect with United.

III.

BACKGROUND

In the instant proceeding, Sunshine Interstate Transmission Company ("SITCO") seeks authorization to construct, own and operate a new interstate natural gas pipeline system originating at an interconnection with the Chandeleur Pipeline near Pascagoula, Mississippi, and terminating at an interconnection in Okaloosa County, Florida, with the facilities of SunShine Pipeline Company, an intrastate pipeline to be constructed within the State of Florida, and

affiliated with SITCO. SITCO proposes that it construct a meter station and interconnect with Gateway at a point near Mobile Bay, indicated somewhat imprecisely on Exhibit F of SITCO's application. SITCO states its intention to use Gateway's system, among others', to provide SITCO's potential customers with direct access to gas reserves from far ranging locations through "transportation arrangements, displacement and backhauls".

IV.

MOTION TO INTERVENE

Gateway requests intervention in this proceeding. Gateway has an interest as a interconnecting pipeline which may be directly affected by the outcome of this docket. In such circumstances, Gateway has a direct and substantial interest in this proceeding which cannot adequately be represented by any other party. Therefore, Gateway is an interested party in this proceeding within the meaning of section 15(a) of the NGA, 15 U.S.C. sec. 717n(a), and its intervention in this proceeding is in the public interest.

PROTEST

Gateway hereby protests SITCO's filing, and requests that the Commission reject the proposed filing as premature and without adequate foundation in supporting data. Prior to the filing of this proceeding, Gateway was not approached by SITCO to discuss the proposed interconnect to determine if the proper system or operational factors had been considered, or to ascertain the feasibility of utilizing capacity on Gateway for SITCO's system. To require a pipeline to be interconnected with a major interstate pipeline system without that pipeline's consent would raise serious issues about a pipeline system's integrity and ability to control its own operations, thereby undermining the level of security required by the owners and customers of the pipeline.

In addition, SITCO has not demonstrated adequate markets in its proposed service area due to the fact that most of the "commitments" in its application are preliminary at best. To approve an application which has not demonstrated adequate preparation or necessity would contravene the public interest, and substantially prejudice the pipeline operations of those systems in the area which are established and which were required to demonstrate the need for their facilities and

services under the analysis heretofore required by this Commission.

Because of the inadequacies of this filing, Gateway respectfully requests that the Commission reject SITCO's request that this application be considered and disposed of under any type of shortened procedural schedule and that no issue raised by this filing be decided without the parties being allowed full discovery rights and a final hearing on the merits of each issue.

WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, Gateway protests and moves to intervene in this proceeding. Gateway requests that it be permitted to participate with full rights as a party in the captioned proceeding.

Your May 12 letter was forwarded to me by the Commission's Division of Records and Reporting. I regret that this letter will not be very helpful in answering either of your requests.

You asked first about the outcome of the May 10 hearing on the pipeline need determination. The hearing's purpose was to take testimony and allow cross-examination of witnesses; no decision was to be reached at the hearing. Each party has since provided its post-hearing brief on issues and legal matters. On June 1, Commission staff will file its recommendation to the Commission. The Commission will then meet June 11 to vote on whether SunShine Pipeline Partners has made its case that the SunShine Pipeline is needed.

I am enclosing a copy of the map provided with the application for determination of need, but it will not be much help in determining where the pipeline will pass through Gilchrist County. This map does not show detail of the intended route. SunShine Pipeline Partners plans to file its siting application with the Department of Environmental Regulation in late July. At that time, SunShine will be required to furnish detailed maps for every mile of the proposed line.



We are very concerned about the siting of new gas and utility lines in Florida. The propensity of these companies to pursue exclusive corridors instead of sharing existing right-of-way or, in the case of new areas, to use the same new corridor, has resulted in a profusion of these lines criss-crossing the state. Add these to the thousands of miles of roads and other disturbances, and the threats to Florida's natural systems and the rich diversity of species which are dependent on these systems become increasingly insurmountable.

Of particular concern is the targeting by pipeline and utility interests of public lands and other relatively unaltered areas. Our banner land-buying program will be significantly affected if these lands are fragmented and not better protected by all entities who influence activities which adversely impact their natural values.

We recognize that the PSC authorities do not include siting, but address whether the need exists for the proposed utility. We do, however, feel that it is important to advise of our concerns about the siting issue, as it follows the PSC determination relative to need for the project.

Our request, per this letter, is to be informed of PSC agendas which include natural gas pipeline needs determinations. SunShine is the only one of which we are aware at this time, but there may be others.



Thank you for your letter and the expression of the Sierra Club's interest in the siting of the SunShine Pipeline Company's proposed natural gas pipeline. We do not, yet have an application from SunShine or from SunCoast Pipeline Company, a United Gas Pipeline Company subsidiary that has also notified us of its intent to file. We expect one of them to file in early January.

This Commission has authority only to determine whether the need exists for an intrastate natural gas pipeline. Responsibility for recommending to the Governor and Cabinet whether the proposed siting of any such pipeline should be approved rests with the Department of Environmental Regulation (DER).

It has recently come to our attention that SunShine Pipeline Company has proposed to site a pipeline on the Apalachicola National Forest, and that an application will be filed with the PSC in late 1972.

We would like to go on record as being strongly opposed to any proposal to site a pipeline on the National Forest. The National Forests in Florida have a critical role in perpetuating native species of flora and fauna, including numerous state and federally listed species, and the complex ecosystems that support these species. It is essential that the Forests be protected from fragmentation and disturbance, situations which cannot be reasonably assured on private lands and on many other areas of public lands. These Forests are unique in that they represent large areas of public lands, areas which can provide habitat for species that cannot exist on smaller sites, and which need relatively undisturbed expanses of habitat for their survival.

There are more detailed reasons why it is inappropriate to consider the Apalachicola National Forest for pipeline sitings, and we would be interested in providing further comments when we review the application.

Please therefore forward a copy of the application for review and comment when it is available.


