Thank you for your letter dated February 16, 1996. We asked Spruce Creek South Utilities, Inc., to provide the Commission with a letter clarifying the notice you received regarding the utility's proposed expansion of territory. Enclosed is the response. This clarification should answer most of your questions. I hope that the clarification resolves your concern. In addition, you indicated you would like to review a plat of the area proposed to be served and the utility's application. Both documents are public records and should be made available to you free of charge from the utility. You may also receive a copy any information filed with the Commission by calling the Division of Records and Reporting at (904) 413-6770. There will be a small charge for this service.

Once you have reviewed the utility's response, the Commission will need to know whether or not you intend to protest the proposed expansion of territory. Would you please provide a written response by May 1, 1996 to:

If you choose to protest the expansion, a hearing will be scheduled in which you must provide testimony or other evidence supporting your protest. Although the Commission allows individuals to represent themselves at hearing, it may be to your benefit to hire an attorney to represent you. Alternatively, the Office of Public Counsel (OPC) may agree to handle the matter on your behalf. OPC is the agency authorized by Florida Statutes to represent utility customers in proceedings before the Commission. You can reach OPC by calling (904) 488-9330.
