REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION

GULF POWER COMPANY ["Gulf Power", "Gulf", or "the Company"], by and through its undersigned attorney and pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, hereby files a request that the Florida Public Service Commission enter an order protecting from public disclosure information obtained by the Commission Staff in its Audit of Gulf Power Company Affiliate Transactions (1993-1997). Certain of this information is regarded as confidential by Gulf Power. As grounds for this request, Gulf Power Company states:

- 1. Gulf Power Company asserts that certain of the information provided to the Commission Staff during its audit of Gulf Power Company Affiliate Transactions (1993-1997) is entitled to confidential classification pursuant to §366.093(3)(e). Florida Statutes, as information, the public disclosure of which would cause irreparable harm to the competitive interests of Gulf Power and the Southern Company.
- 2. Information was provided to the Commission Staff in the form of responses to document requests. The public disclosure of certain portions of the information provided in the document responses would cause irreparable harm to the competitive interests of Gulf Power.

 The information for which confidential classification is sought discusses contractual terms with DOCUMENT ALL MOTERATE

vendors and affiliates and internal audit reports/findings of Gulf Power Company.

- 3. Submitted as Exhibit "A" are copies of the documents submitted by Gulf Power

 Company in response to Staff audit requests, on which is highlighted the information for which
 confidential classification is requested. In instances where confidential classification is sought
 for an entire report, study or document, a cover sheet indicating such accompanies the document
 and a line-by-line highlighting is not provided. Exhibit "A" should be treated as confidential
 pending a ruling on this request. Attached as Exhibit "B" are two (2) edited copies of the
 information for which confidential classification is sought, which may be made available for
 public review and inspection. A cover page indicating that confidential classification is sought
 for an entire report, study or document is substituted for the two (2) edited copies where
 applicable. Attached as Exhibit "C" to this request is a line-by-line/field-by-field justification for
 the request for confidential classification.
- The material for which confidential classification is requested is intended to be, and is treated as, confidential by Gulf Power Company and has not been otherwise publicly disclosed.

WHEREFORE, Gulf Power Company respectfully requests that the Commission enter an order protecting the information identified on Exhibit "A" from public disclosure as proprietary confidential business information.
