SPRINT'S REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION PURSUANT TO SECTION 364.183(1), FLORIDA STATUTES

Sprint-Florida, Incorporated ("Sprint"), pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(5), Florida Administrative Code, hereby requests that the Florida Public Service Commission ("Commission") classify certain documents and/or records identified herein as confidential, exempt from public disclosure under Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, and issue any appropriate protective order reflecting such a decision. The information that is the subject of this request is contained in certain documents contained in Sprint's Responses to Staff's Second Request for Production of Documents, Request No. 17.

- 1. The following documents are the subject of this request:
 - a. Strategic Sourcing Master Designated Work for Construction Agreement between Sprint/United Management Company and The Fishel Company, Inc.
 - b. Strategic Sourcing Master Designated Work forConstruction Agreement between Sprint/United

- c. Strategic Sourcing Master Designated Work for Construction Agreement between Sprint/United Management Company and MASTEC North America, Inc.
- 2. One unredacted copy of the documents has been submitted to the Division of Records and Reporting under seal this same day.
- 3. The confidential information is identified by yellow highlighting. The information for which the Request is submitted is vendor-specific pricing and provisioning (or information from which such information can be derived), negotiated by Sprint. Public disclosure of this information would seriously impair Sprint's ability to contract for goods and/or services on favorable terms, and thus meets the definition of confidential proprietary business information pursuant to Section 364.183(a)(d) and (e), Florida Statutes. Section 364.183(3) provides:
 - (3) The term "proprietary confidential business information" means information, regardless of form or characteristics, which is owned or controlled by the person or company, is intended to be and is treated by the person or company as private in that the disclosure of the information would cause harm to the ratepayers or the person's or company's business operations, and has not been disclosed unless disclosed pursuant to a statutory provision, an order of a court or administrative body, or private agreement that provides that the information will not

be released to the public. The term includes, but is not limited to:

- (a) Trade secrets.
- (b) Internal auditing controls and reports of internal auditors.
- (c) Security measures, systems, or procedures.
- (d) Information concerning bids or other contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of the company or its affiliates to contract for goods or services on favorable terms.
- (e) Information relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of information.
- (f) Employee personnel information unrelated to compensation, duties, qualifications, or responsibilities.
- 4. Furthermore, Section 688.002(4), Florida Statutes, is instructive on what constitutes a trade secret and provides that:
 - (4) "Trade secret" means information, including a formula, pattern, compilation, program, device, method, technique, or process that:
 - (a) Derives independent economic value, actual or potential, from not being generally known to, and not being readily ascertainable by proper means by, other persons who can obtain economic value from its disclosure or use; and
 - (b) Is the subject of efforts that are reasonable under the circumstances to maintain its secrecy.
- 5. The subject information has not been publicly released by Sprint. Furthermore, release of the information would impair

the efforts of the company to contract for goods and/or services on favorable terms, thus causing harm to the company's business operations.

6. The Commission has found similar information to be confidential. See, Order No. PSC-01-2504-CFO-TP, issued December 21, 2001; In re: Investigation into pricing of unbundled network elements. Docket No. 990649-TP.

Based on the foregoing, Sprint respectfully requests that the Commission grant the Request for Confidential Classification, exempt the information from disclosure under Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, and issue any appropriate protective order, protecting the information from disclosure while it is maintained at the Commission.
