

- (b) The name, address, and telephone number of the petitioner; the name, address, and telephone number of the petitioner's representative, if any, which shall be the address for service purposes during the course of the proceeding; and an explanation of how the petitioner's substantial interests will be affected by the agency determination;
 - (c) A statement of when and how the petitioner received notice of the agency decision;
 - (d) A statement of all disputed issues of material fact. If there are none, the petition must so indicate;
- (e) A concise statement of the ultimate facts alleged, including the specific facts the petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the agency's proposed action;
- (f) A statement of the specific rules or statutes the petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the agency's proposed action, including an explanation of how the alleged facts relate to the specific rules or statutes; and
- (g) A statement of the relief sought by the petitioner, stating precisely the action petitioner wishes the agency to take with respect to the agency's proposed action.
- (3) Upon receipt of a petition involving disputed issues of material fact, the agency shall grant or deny the petition, and if granted shall, unless otherwise provided by law, refer the matter to the Division of Administrative Hearings with a request that an administrative law judge be assigned to conduct the hearing. The request shall be accompanied by a copy of the petition and a copy of the notice of agency action.



We are writing to urge the Public Service Commission (PSC) to deny AQUA Utilities Florida, Inc.'s application for a transfer of the waste-water certificate from Harbor Hills Utilities pursuant to Docket No. 110019-WS, as it is not in the best interest of the public and, in particular, your constituents. Despite AQUA's assertions in its application, "The proposed acquisition would place the water and wastewater operations of the Harbor Hills water and wastewater system in the hands of an experienced company and industry leader whose sole focus in the provision of high quality water and wastewater service at reasonable prices." AQUA's track record is contrary to this. 

- 4. There is much concern about the accuracies associated with documentation provided by Aqua and legal notices that were provided.



"The company service is just as bad as it was (years ago)," Reams said. "The company just ignores its customers."

Aqua Utilities Florida President Judy Wallingford said that although the PSC didn't grant the full increase her company sought, the approved amount was a recognition that continued repairs and improvements to the systems were warranted.

Wallingford did not immediately know if improvements were slated for the company's utilities in either Marion or Alachua counties.

"We knew that our customers weren't 100 percent happy with some of the aesthetic (qualities of the) system," she said.

Although the water meets state and federal standards, Wallingford said there have been problems with taste and odor. She said that the systems were being addressed as funding became available.

Aqua is a relatively small water utility in Marion County.

Marion County Utilities has nearly 29,000 customers, followed by Ocala Utility Services, which provides water to nearly 23,000 customers. Belleview's municipal utility service has about 2,200 customers.

There are 16 non-municipal utility companies operating in Marion County, according to PSC records.

Even before the hikes, Aqua already had the second-highest water rates in Marion, according to PSC documents.

Reams said that if Aqua customers were unhappy enough, they might always resort to sinking their own wells and bypassing their water supplier."







As the owners of two homes in Harbor Hills, my husband and I wrote a letter to you on January 29, 2011 regarding the notice the Application for Approval of Transfer of the Water System of Harbor Hills Utility, L.P. in Lake County Florida to Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc. and Amendment of AUF's Certificate No. 106W. Included in our initial letter were fourteen questions and concerns regarding AUF. Since that time most of our questions have been addressed and we are appalled at the record this company has, not only in Florida but in the other states where they provide water to the citizens. We understand the number of complaints about them that have been submitted to you totals more than all other complaints combined! Approval of the transfer certainly would not be in the public's interest.

We also would like you to consider that the initial proposed wastewater service documentation that was submitted by AUF was flawed and new documents had to be submitted. We question the accuracy of the information in the revised proposal and feel that the Notice that was provided to the Harbor Hills residents was inaccurate and unclear.

Although the planning for the sale took nearly two years, the residents were neither informed nor notified about it until January 2011. If we had been, we could have organized to make an offer to buy it ourselves. The Harbor Hills property owners had a meeting on March 22, 2011 regarding this issue. There were over 500 people in attendance to hear about AUF. Since our follow up March 24, 2011 letter to you, we have become aware of the fact that the residents of Harbor Hills intend to research

possible alternatives that could include local governmental areas or forming a cooperative made up of Harbor Hills residents.

. We are requesting the Commission members note our objections to the transfer of the certificate from a utility that has given the community good water and good service to a company that has a record of charging exorbitant rates for delivering poor quality water and giving their customers poor service.

We ask the Public Service Commission to do a thorough investigation of the AUF's past and present operations in Florida before considering the transfer of the Harbor Hills Utility to them. We encourage the commission to deny the transfer, or if more time is needed, postpone action so that they can investigate the other options. If more information on these alternatives is necessary, we suggest that the commissioners delay the transfer to get any additional facts they deem necessary. We feel further investigation will show that an approval to transfer the certificate is very definitely not in the best interests of the public.







We have learned that the water, wastewater systems of Harbor Hills, LP are in the process of being sold to Aqua Utilities of Florida Inc. (AUF). As residents of Harbor Hills, LP, we were unaware of the negotiations which spanned nearly two years, between Harbor Hills and Aqua Systems. Nor were we informed of the proposed sale of the water system to Aqua Utilities of Florida. It was brought to our attention only through the required Florida PSC notice and again on June 22.

The quality of water is vital to our community. It is so important to our health, quality of life here in Harbor Hills. My wife and I strongly oppose this transfer for many reasons:

- We have done our own research on Aqua Water Systems. In many communities where they
 have assumed control of the water system, water quality has deteriorated while costs to



Dear Public Service Commission Commissioners:

My name is John Skoglund and I live at 6141 Landings Blvd., Lady Lake, in the Harbor Hills community in Lake County. I was informed by letter of the proposed transfer of the Harbor Hills Utilities L.P. to Aqua Utilities Florida by the purchaser in January 2011 in a notice required by the Public Service Commission. I would become both a water and waste water customer. I have spent numerous hours reading document filings, letters, the Annual Report of Aqua America, the parent company of Aqua Utilities of Florida, viewing the January 28th 2011 news report on WFLTV Channel 9, reading a position paper by Food & Water Watch about Aqua America, paying close attention to the section in the report about Aqua America's dealings in Florida, and the Public Service Commission's response to Aqua's requests. Lastly I have talked to people who have had loved ones who are customers and the dealings they have had with Aqua. After all the "data" collecting, I have come to the conclusion IT IS NOT IN THE PUBLIC'S BEST INTEREST TO TRANSFER THE PERMITS AND CERTIFICATES TO SUPPLY WATER AND WASTEWATER SERVICES from Harbor Hills Utilities L.P. to Aqua Utilities Florida.

In reading Mr. May's supplied response to Public Service Commission statement, "....Staff identified certain deficiencies and requested additional information related to the water and waste water applications in the referenced docket", I am concerned with some of the responses provided. What is troubling to me is that the sale of the Utility has purported to have been in negotiation on and off for approximately two years and yet the filing with the Public Service Commission for transfer of assets and operations seemed to be rushed and was incomplete. When providing the requested additional information, Mr. May uses responses to some questions on deficiencies that something was "inadvertently" left in the agreement from a prior draft, something was "inadvertently" left out, or notices "inadvertently" contained a typographical error. Is this just another example of how the Purchaser's does business? I assume(maybe incorrectly) that Aqua Utilities Florida and Holland & Knight have either individually or together have submitted applications to the Public Service Commission before. I would have thought that a legal document such as this would not necessitate the number of additions an/or corrections that seem to be needed.

Secondly, I have read and reread with great interest the section on waste water service and Mr. May's response. I believe the projections Mr. May offers are based on flawed data that leads to inaccurate assumptions and ultimately inflated initial waste water treatment rates requested. Assuming that the

total of 55 waste water customers is accurate, 54 are homeowners and one LARGE user is the Harbor Hill Country Club Clubhouse. If not that, then to use Mr. May's terminology, the Country Club Clubhouse was "inadvertently" left out as a significant discharge creator. Either way the Clubhouse is a large generator of waste water. This is a facility that has two locker rooms complete with showers, toilets, whirlpools, etc. The clubhouse also has both a large food preparation area to serve large parties in two dining rooms on the main floor and also a smaller "grill" that serves various meal offerings twothree times a day on the lower floor along with the locker rooms and exterior bathrooms with showers for the swimming pool users. Restrooms are on both levels to be used by the general public and staff working in the Clubhouse. To my knowledge, neither the Clubhouse or any individual home has ever been metered to measure waste water. If one wanted to arrive at a realistic figure to develop initial rates at the very minimum a meter should be placed on the Clubhouse for a prescribed period of time to develop realistic average monthly discharge amount. After arriving at that figure, it could be multiplied by 12 to arrive at the yearly amount that the Clubhouse contributed and then it should be subtracted from the total gallon figure that Mr. May refers to as totally homeowner usage(but really a combination of homeowner and clubhouse usage) to provide valid usage by the collective homeowners. It is THAT reduced, new homeowner figure, that then can be used in the rest of the calculations to establish "reached capacity" of the system and also provide the initial waste water rate. It would also allow AUF to establish a reasonable rate for the Clubhouse based on its usage. Mr. May's existing proposal is flawed because it doesn't reflect the unequal discharge amounts between the average homeowner and the Clubhouse. The Sunrise II section which has the majority of the houses and condominiums, along with the ten condominium units originally built about the same time as the Clubhouse are located between the Clubhouse and the treatment facility. I believe the Sunrise II section(of which I'm a resident) was required to connect to the sewer system because a previous developer got a Federally backed loan to build this section. Our lots are smaller than the average lot in Harbor Hills and probably would not have the square footage to support a septic tank and drain field even with the smaller houses and condominiums that are present. Many of the houses and units in this section are occupied by seasonal residents and seasonal rental users who would not be generating the waste water discharge in the amount projected by Mr. May's figures. This last additional information adds more credibility to the idea that the Clubhouse is a major contributor to that large discharge figure with which Mr. May begins his calculations. Using this "broad brush" calculation procedure would burden the homeowners with a higher per gallon charge of \$6.42 that is being proposed. Coupled with this projected overcharge, the biggest user, the Clubhouse owned and operated by the seller of the water utility, would benefit greatly (along with the purchaser, Aqua) with rates not proportionate to its greater usage. Even with these same rates for the Developer's Clubhouse as those of the homeowner, the Developer would still be paying less than he typically would on a "tiered" structure based on usage and the homeowners are "saddled" with inflated initial waste water rates, subsidizing the Developer's business. It is also this inflated figure from which Aqua Utilities Florida would continue to request higher and higher rate increases in the future. Thirdly, I am unaware of any section in development or projected to be developed by 2014 close to the treatment facility or the general pattern of the existing piping infrastructure where a connection could be made that would support the new customer projections. There is a smaller section of vacant land at the north entrance to the Harbor Hills community that is contiguous to the existing waste water piping system that could be used for future additions that Mr. May talks about. The reality is this parcel would not bring the Developer much profit because of the type of units he would build. He has much more desirable land in Harbor Hills available that would garner him more profit. It is my belief that this is one time where the provided "projections" are without merit and useless.

Commissioners, it is a well known fact by yourselves and the customers of Aqua Utilities Florida that Aqua Utilities Florida has had numerous violations and complaints filed with the Commission. The

Commission has in the past and continues to address the inadequate service being provided customers, and dealing with the poor, and many times totally unacceptable, water quality being provided by the Aqua Company. Many areas that Aqua Florida serve, people are trying to or have succeeded in severing their contract relationship with Aqua because of its inability to provide an acceptable product with reasonable service at an affordable cost. Unfortunately, far too many people were unaware of the practices Aqua engages in and now are unable to undo what has been done. This current request by Aqua is at a point where evidence clearly exists that the transfer of water and waste water operating certificates to Aqua Utilities Florida from Harbor Hills Utilities L.P. SHOULD NOT TAKE PLACE. One more group of citizens should not be subjected to Aqua Utilities Florida and their business model. It is time to "close the door" on any further expansion of Aqua Utilities Florida in this State. Thank you in advance for your time and thoughtful consideration of my comments and concerns. I apologize for the length of this communication, but what I have shared needed to be said.

A representative from Aqua spoke to us a few months ago. She said water rates would not go up for two years. What about extra fees for repairs in other states? Aqua is a corporation with stock holders. They don't lose money. A company with holdings in 13 states, with a terrible track record. They have many lawsuits pending. Why should we believe anything a representative tells us about a company like that.

A friend of mine lives in Fruitland Park, Fl., where Aqua bought the water system and raised the rates 300% almost immediately. He had to stop watering the lawn and cancel his cable to make payments. With regard to the above referenced docket, we, as customers of Harbor Hills Utilities (HHU) ask that Florida Public Services Commission take the following items into consideration prior to granting an approval of transfer of HHU to Agua Utilities Florida, Inc(AUFI):

- 1. Verifiable reports of the unsatisfactory reputation, performance and response to customers by AUFI bring into question their ability to operate a utility in a safe manner.
- 2. AUFI's practice of imposing a \$50 per month facility charge even when its customers don't use a drop of water is simply price gouging. Has anyone asked them to justify this charge? If its purpose is to make money to pay dividends, the Public Services Commission must protect the consumer, and ensure that the dividends are not being raised with the burden resting unreasonably on the back of the customers.
- 3. The Public Services Commission must take into consideration the fact that if the transfer of water certificate is approved, we become a captive consumer - we have no choice. We can't simply go across town and buy from another vendor. We are trapped. Therefore we ask that the Public Services Commission carefully examine the qualifications and reputation of AUFI prior to approving this transfer.

At the very least, please consider a moratorium on the transfer of



the certificate until the quality of service, the investigation of the number and type of complaints, and the billing practices of AUFI have been fully researched.

You may question why these concerns are raised at such a late date. Although the sale has been in negotiations for about two years, we have just recently learned about them.




Dear Ms. Cole:

I have been informed that the water and wastewater systems of the Harbor Hills Utilities, LP are being sold to Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc (AUF). While these negotiations were underway for almost two years, many property owners in Harbor Hills were unaware of the proposed sale, and only learned of it in January 2011 through required PSC notice and again on June 22.

As one many property owner in Harbor Hills, I strongly object to this transfer for the following reasons:

- This transfer of the water systems to AUF is not in the public interest. We have a good water system and pay reasonable rates currently. Based on media reports that I have seen and read in the past month the reputation and business practices of AUF in other areas of Florida are highly questionable. Why would we want to have this entity take over our water system given these concerns over prospective rate increases and deterioration in quality service and product? The public interest will not be served if this transfer is approved.
- In the Harbor Hills Community, dozens of homes are currently on the market as a result of very slow sales, bank foreclosures, vacated properties, etc. Property values have plunged to around 50-60% of the original purchase prices of our homes due to the grave housing market which has hit Florida especially hard in recent years. The majority of homeowners in Harbor Hills are senior citizens and most of us will be faced with selling our homes in coming years due to increasing age, illness, loss of a spouse, etc. As difficult as it is to sell a home in Harbor Hills today, it will become much more difficult if owners have to deal with potentially exorbitant water rates and/or poor water services, which would certainly turn off prospective buyers.

I summary, from media information that I have seen in recent weeks, I believe the reputation and performance record of AUF is highly questionable. Aqua has been singled out by Senator Schumer of New York for questionable business practices and most recently by our own Senator Nelson for Aqua's recently proposed rate increase. Additionally, as I understand it, AUF has been the subject of a significant number of customer complaints filed over the last several years. This in itself should bring into question how they may intend to operate in Florida and should be a red flag to the PSC and other state agencies that would allow them to expand their operations and customer base in Florida.



I request that the Public Service Commission undertake a very thorough investigation on the past and present operations and business practices of AUF, prior to taking any action on the Certificate transfer from Harbor Hills Utilities to AUF. Again, I believe that such a transfer will not be in public interest and certainly not in the interest of the property owners in Harbor Hills.



We are writing to urge the Public Service Commission (PSC) to deny AQUA Utilities Florida, Inc.'s application for a transfer of the waste-water certificate from Harbor Hills Utilities pursuant to Docket No. 110019-WS, as it is not in the best interest of the public and, in particular, your constituents. Despite AQUA's assertions in its application, "The proposed acquisition would place the water and wastewater operations of the Harbor Hills water and wastewater system in the hands of an experienced company and industry leader whose sole focus in the provision of high quality water and wastewater service at reasonable prices." AQUA's track record is contrary to this. The horror stories of ever-increasing, excessive rates, billing nightmares, poor water quality, and inadequate service, abound throughout AQUA's service areas to include Florida. 

I am strongly opposed to the pending transfer of ownership of the Harbor Hills Utility to Aqua Utilities. The track record of this firm boarders on being criminal. Massive increases, poor service, questionable quality of the water are just a few items. It amazes me that rate increases are approved on a regular basis by the commission with no regard to the product and service delivered, I was under the IMPRESSION that the commission was supposed to PROTECT THE CONSUMER.

We have not even started with this fin and the initial correspondence with them seems to be lacking, either by design or ineptness. The initial letter, was delivered in January 2011, it states that any objection must be filed within 30 days of the date identified in the letter. That date was January 7 2010. We have a large number of homes either in foreclosure or bank owned now, the result of this sale will only worsen this situation. The developer has stated that 100 or so homes are in arrears on payment of homeowners dues.

I am also concerned about the pending law suits between the Grove and Harbor Hills pertaining to the water that the developer cut off. Will this be settled prior to the sale?

If this sale is approved will the developer still be able to take water from lake Griffin for the golf course, and to sell to certain residential areas as he is doing now.?

I am also wondering what the status of the Harbor Hills Club House will be. It will be serviced by AUF, the anticipated price for that service will be rather high. I assume that we the consumer, would be advised, prior to the sale if an arrangement was made between Harbor Hills and AUF as it pertains to the developers charges for water and waste treatment? Are they required to divulge any type of arrangement?

In closing ,thank you for your attention to this mater. I hope that impact on the consumers involved in this matter is paramount in the decisions of your board. Aqua has a record that is counter productive to any community. I would hate to see this community go under due to the sale of this water utility. It is time for the PSC to stand up and be counted, We the consumers need protection and you are the organization that is charted to do that, do not let Aqua destroy another community.







We were advised of this transaction very recently through the required PSC notice. However, we have also learned that the negotiations have been conducted confidentially for nearly two years without any opportunity for public interaction. Since the utility is a monopoly the only protection afforded to citizens is through the Florida Public Service Commission. We strongly urge that Director Devlin and the Commission halt the transfer, analyze the transaction and conduct an investigation of the performance of Aqua Utilities in Florida and other states in America.

We firmly believe the transfer of the water system to Aqua Utilities is not in the public interest. A significant amount of information is publicly available that documents Aqua's exorbitantly high rates and poor water quality in many communities in which Aqua operates in Florida.

Aqua's communication to residents of Harbor Hills dated June 22, 2011 states to that AUF is proposing to charge "the" existing rates on a monthly basis. The "the" is AUFs existing rates and the communication fails to state that AUF rates are more than three times higher than our current rates. As twelve-year residents of Harbor Hills, Lake County, my wife and I recently received notification that the water (and wastewater) systems of the Harbor Hills Utilities, LP are in the process of being sold to Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc (AUF).

We do not dispute the right of the developer to sell his property. However, we have sincere concerns about the great likelihood of this sale's negative impact on the quality of our water and current lifestyle. Therefore, we strongly oppose this transfer. We further understand that the consummation of this sale is contingent upon AUF receiving approval from the Florida Public Service Commission.

Ms. Cole, it is often said, "past history is the best predictor of future behavior". We believe the reputation and performance record of AUF is highly questionable based on the facts and experiences reported in Florida and other States. Below I offer a few of many—allegations that have appeared within the public domain over the past few months:

- FlowFlorida.com reports that Aqua has been at the center of controversy in recent years over a series of rate increase requests. Residents have complained the rates are unjustified and unaffordable and have criticized Aqua's documented poor customer service record.
- July 1, 2011: According to Filed Document #04525, dated July 1, 2011, the citizens from the
 State of Florida, through the Office of Public Counsel "disputed issues of material facts,
 including he Commission's finding of marginal quality of service provided by Aqua to its
 customers in the PAA Order should be set aside. Aqua's quality of service should be found to
 be unsatisfactory. The Commission should lower Aqua's return on equity (ROE) by 100 basis
 points based on its less than satisfactory quality of service."
- June 30, 2011: According to an article by the St. Petersburg Times, "State environmental officials have warned Aqua Utilities about "possible violations of law" at two sewage plants in west Pasco. The article went on to say, "The letter describes tennis ball-sized "solids" floating in one tank and a foot of sewage in an area that shouldn't have any solid waste. Findings at the Jasmine Lakes plant include excessive waste and leaking equipment. A report from March found each plant exceeded certain bacteria levels in treated water."

- June 3, 2011: According to an article on Ocala.Com, "Water rates will increase a hefty 65.5 percent for Marion County customers of Aqua Utilities Florida, which serves the Ocala Oaks subdivision. The hike makes it the most expensive water utility in Marion."
- May 25, 2011, TALLAHASSEE: According to a report on seekingalphia.com, "More than 100 customers of Aqua Utilities Florida attended today's Florida Public Service Commission meeting, asking the commission not to grant the \$4.1 million rate hike the company wants. Bearing jars filled with water they said was foul-smelling and white socks that turned yellow when washed, customers from tiny communities such as Jasmine Lakes, Palm Terrace and Zephyr Shores in Pasco County relayed story after story about the company's substandard service and billing practices, already high rates and poor water quality."
- March 21, 2011: U.S. Senator Bill Nelson, FL, jumped into the debate over Aqua Utilities' proposed rate increase for 117,000 Aqua Utilities customers that is pending before the Florida Public Service Commission. Nelson complained about the rate increase in a letter to PSC Chairman Art Graham. (Nelson's request is similar to a resolution approved last November by the Polk County Commission asking PSC members to delay or reduce the rate increase.)
- February 18, 2011: WFTV (CH 9) reported, "Dozens of Lake County residents are fighting to keep a controversial company out of their water supply. Aqua Utilities wants the state to approve its purchase of a company that served 700 people near Lady Lake."
- January 28, 2011: WFTV (CH 9) reported, "A troubled water company is causing more problems Friday. Some homeowners in Lake County told WFTV that their bills are so high, and their water is so dirty, that they're digging their own wells."
- July 28, 2010, WFTV (CH 9) reported, "This is one of the most unexplainable water bills WFTV has ever seen. A Mims woman uses so little water that her bills are usually only \$15 per month. Now, out of nowhere, her bill jumped to more than \$300, and she says she's not using any more water." [Customer], "says she can't drink the water from her faucet, she doesn't water her lawn, and she uses only paper plates."

 Aqua Utilities has faced problems in other areas, as well. WFTV covered numerous complaints quality in Chuluota in Seminole County. Last year, the state rated Chuluota's water system as unsatisfactory and, earlier this year, the state ordered Aqua Utilities to monitor water quality for the rest of the year at several other sites.
- August 2, 2010, WFTV (CH 9) reported, CENTRAL FLORIDA -- Another customer told
 WFTV Monday that Aqua Utilities overcharged her hundreds of dollars. It's one of several
 complaints that have come in to WFTV. Except this time, her son-in-law installed a second
 water meter and now the two don't match up. WFTV confronted state regulators who are
 supposed to be tracking the accuracy of Aqua's meters. At 94 years old, [Customer] doesn't
 see too well, but the charges on her latest water bill from Aqua Utilities were (continued)

> hard to miss "I thought it was a joke." She was charged \$560 for more than 30,000 gallons of water at her small duplex near Lake Placid. "Is there any way you used 30,000 gallons of water last month?" WFTV reporter Eric Rasmussen asked. "That would be impossible. I used the same amount as every month," she said.

March 16, 2010, Tallahassee, Fla.—Kicking off a coordinated effort to improve water service for millions of Floridians, FLOW Florida, a coalition of community groups from 19 counties around the state, and the consumer advocacy group Food & Water Watch, spoke out against the private water provider Aqua Utilities Florida (Aqua). Standing before the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC), residents representing Aqua customers in Pasco, Polk, Seminole, Volusia and the other 15 counties where Aqua operates, spoke of the smelly, often undrinkable water, exorbitant rates, and unresolved customer issues suffered under the company's service.

Florida is not the only state showing alleged issues of concern:

According to reports, Aqua America, Aqua Utilities Florida's parent company, has also come under attack in recent years, with many of its other systems such as those in New York, Ohio, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and Texas facing service problems similar to those in Florida. The city of Fort Wayne, Indiana—after experiencing yellow water and soaring bills, moved in 2009 to cancel its contract with Aqua America, and restore its water to public control.


August, 2010: United States Senator Charles E. Schume, called for the General Accountability Office (GAO), the investigative arm of Congress, to examine Aqua America, Inc.'s continued eligibility to receive federal funds, citing questionable business practices of its New York subsidiary, Aqua New York, and a recent report by Food and Water Watch that raised concerns about the company's aggressive strategy to raise consumer water rates.

Ms. Cole, as stated previously, We strongly oppose this transfer. The prior alleged critical issues along with others—demand that we, as concerned residents of Harbor Hills, Lake County, not ignore this most important matter. 

Dear Chairman Graham,

We are writing to urge the Public Service Commission (PSC) to deny AQUA Utilities Florida, Inc.'s application for a transfer of the waste-water certificate from Harbor Hills Utilities pursuant to Docket No. 110019-WS, as it is not in the best interest of the public and, in particular, your constituents. Despite AQUA's assertions in its application, "The proposed acquisition would place the water and wastewater operations of the Harbor Hills water and wastewater system in the hands of an experienced company and industry leader whose sole focus in the provision of high quality water and wastewater service at reasonable prices." AQUA's track record is contrary to this. The horror stories of ever-increasing, excessive rates, billing nightmares, poor water quality, and inadequate service, abound throughout AQUA's service areas to include Florida. Chuluota, Seminole County is experiencing, on average, 3 times the cost for water and sewage that nearby Oviedo is paying. Seminole County is working to purchase back the system from AQUA, but has not agreed to a valuation as yet. AQUA is saying that the value is about 4 times the valuation specified by Seminole County. The residents of Harbor Hills do not want to be faced with this situation. Additionally, AQUA is responsible for the great majority of complaints to the PSC by consumers, and they have also been fined for their billing problems. We, along with my neighbors, your constituents, urge you to ensure that Aqua's request for the transfer of the certificate be denied.

Because of inaccuracies in its original notification, Aqua Utilities of Florida was directed by the PSC to re-issue their letters of application for transfer of the water utility from Harbor Hills. Therefore, I am re-submitting my earlier letter, dated 3/23/11, to the PSC to deny this transfer. Nothing has changed. Witness the recent 65% rate increase for Aqua customers in Marion County and the PSC reprimand of the company for its "marginal quality of service". My earlier letter to you follows:

I am a resident of the Harbor Hills community located in Lady Lake, Florida. Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc (Aqua) has made application for approval to transfer the Harbor Hills Utility, LP to Aqua. I encourage the Commission to deny this transfer as it is *not in the public interest*.

As I am sure the Commission is aware, Aqua does <u>not</u> enjoy a good reputation among its customer base in Florida. There are numerous complaints by communities and individuals of poor water quality, inferior service and unaffordable rates. Hopefully, the PSC is currently investigating Aqua's operations in our state.

Although this pending transfer has been in the works for almost two years, residents of Harbor Hills were not informed until January 2011, when we received a notice from Aqua. The developer (Michael Rich), who is also the president of the Harbor Hills HOA, intentionally kept residents out of the loop regarding the proposed sale of the utility company to Aqua. At a meeting of about 500 residents on March 22, 2011, homeowners, by show of hands, expressed their unanimous support to request the assistance of the Office of Public Counsel to identify other options and possible alternatives.

I am requesting the Commission to rule in the best interests of the homeowners in our community by denying the transfer of water certificates from Harbor Hills Utility to Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc.



This letter respectfully requests that the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC) reject the application of AUF to transfer the water and waste water systems of Harbor Hills Utilities, L.P. to them. As you are certainly aware, AUF has a demonstrated unsatisfactory performance record in Florida that has resulted in many protests before the PSC and other public fora. No further transfer of water systems should be granted this business entity until a thorough investigation of its past and present operations has been completed to assure the public that its operations and practices are proper and in the public interest.

As ten year residents of the Harbor Hills Community in Lake County, Florida, my wife and I are very disturbed to learn of this pending transfer of our community water system to AUF. We understand that this sale has been in the works for over two years, yet we were not notified until late January this year in a lengthy, very vague and highly legalistic notice that stated essentially this deal is done. Since this notification contained inaccuracies, it was necessary for AUF to send us a corrected notice dated June 22, 2011. Given this very late notice, the total lack of any consideration of alternative options or buyers, and the terrible reputation of AUF, the sole purchaser, we strongly oppose this transfer.

Water, along with air, is one of only two items essential to life itself. Existing law mandates that a homeowners' association must be given the right of first refusal whenever recreational facilities serving the community are offered for sale. It's ironic that this right of first refusal is not granted to the community involving a life sustaining service as water. Your decision to investigate AUF operations will be applied by the residents of Harbor Hills and many other Floridians.

Please file this as our formal objection to the Application for transfer of Harbor Hills Utilities to Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc. (AUF) based on our concerns listed herein. Because water is vital to our health and vital to our quality of life here in Harbor Hills, we oppose this transfer of our current water system to AUF and believe that the transfer is not in the public's best interest based on the following:

- With the AUF's proposed addition of monthly wastewater charges and monthly meter charges alone, our calculations indicate that our personal utility bill will increase by a minimum of 374%, as compared to our current rates.
- 2) Evidence of historical and ongoing concerns related to AUF's water quality, services and excessive rates as reflected in PSC Docket No.s 100330-WS and 080121-WS (Application for increase in water/wastewater rates in Alachua, Brevard, DeSoto, Hardee, Highlands, Lake, Lee, Marion, Orange, Palm Beach, Pasco, Polk, Putnam, Seminole, Sumter, Volusia, and Washington Counties by Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc.) which contain numerous documents containing concerns submitted by customers.

Most notable is a letter from the State of Florida Office of Public Council, Attorney's for the Citizens of Florida (document 02124-11) citing specific, and numerous complaints and concerns regarding AUF's services within those 17 counties. This document refers to a PSC order (PSC-10-0297-PAA-WS) requiring monitoring of AUF's quality of Service due to numerous quality concerns. The Florida Office of Public Council letter cites that even after the initial monitoring, customer testimony at nine customer meetings held in Aqua service territories revealed that Aqua's poor quality of service was still a major issue along with the extremely high rates that customers were already paying.

- 3) Supporting our concerns of historically excessive rates charged by AUF is an article published June 3, 2011 in the Ocala Star Banner stating, that AUF was seeking a 65.5% rate hike for existing Aqua customers in the Ocala Oaks Subdivision in Marion County "making it the most expensive water utility in Marion County".
- 4) Numerous locally aired TV news reports have highlighted customers complaining about AUF and of their poor water quality, poor customer service, extremely high costs and rate increases.
- 5) We believe the reputation and performance record of AUF is highly questionable not only in Florida, but in other States, such as Ohio.
- 6) Due to higher rates, if the transfer to AUF occurs we believe there is a high potential of a negative effect on home sales and it will certainly impact numerous fixed income households, ourselves included. Our community is already experiencing foreclosures and delinquent association dues during this struggling economy.

Prior to the transfer of the Harbor Hills Utilities, LP to AUF, we respectfully request that the Public Service Commission do a thorough investigation of AUF's past and present operations in the State of Florida with respect to water quality, customer complaints, their high water and wastewater rates, and whether corrective action(s) have taken place (or a lack of action) by AUF to correct those issues. If the results of the investigation support our concerns, we ask that the PSC <u>please</u> act on behalf of our community's best interests and deny the transfer of the Harbor Hills Utilities, LP certificate(s) to AUF so that we may avoid the numerous issues that other Aqua customers within our great state of Florida are experiencing.

The undersigned received an undated "Revised Notice..." yesterday and as an aggrieved future customer objects with particularity to the following matters relating to this notice and application:

- I. The proposed wastewater rates set forth do substantially exceed those charged currently by Harbor Hills Utilities and are without a rational basis, and are supported by neither clear and convincing evidence nor a preponderance of evidence, whichever is applicable.
- II. The proposed wastewater rates on their face totally ignore, and fail to advise the Commission, that the largest and dominant user of the wastewater system is a forprofit, commercial enterprise, viz., 1. clubhouse, 2. swimming pool complex, 3. locker rooms and spas, 4. restaurants, 5. golf operations, and 6. tennis facilities owned by Harbor Hills Country Club. The application should be tabled and deferred until and unless the applicant makes clear and details its proposed commercial wastewater rates and the methodology and justification for computing them, methodology for measuring usage by of its aforementioned facilities.

III. To apply the same wastewater base rate and also the proposed gallonage cap of 6,000 gallons to the Harbor Hills Country Club commercial enterprise as would be applied to a single residential home is arbitrary, capricious, irrational, unfair, and contrary to law and the public interest.

- IV. The Revised Notice does not indicate if the proposed water rates are monthly or bi-monthly as is currently the case with Harbor Hills Utilities.
- V. The "General Service" section appears to relate to water rates but does not say so. Assuming that it does, the proposed rates are subject to the same objections set out in I. above.
- VI. The application relating to water rates should be tabled and deferred until and unless the applicant makes clear and details its proposed commercial water rates and the methodology and justification for computing them, and the methodology for measuring usage by Harbor Hills Country Club at each of its aforementioned commercial sites and facilities.







Our opposition is fueled by media reports which we have personally viewed and read which portray Aqua as a horrific provider of services with a careless attitude toward customers.



Residents Dig Wells To Bypass Water Company

Residents Dig Wells To Bypass Water Company

LAKE COUNTY, Fla. - A troubled water company is causing more problems Friday. Some homeowners in Lake County told WFTV that their bills are so high, and their water is so dirty, that they're digging their own wells.

Barbara Stemm moved into the Scottish Highlands subdivision, which is serviced by Aqua Utilities, just over two years ago. But in period of a year, she said her monthly water bill rose from \$60 to more than \$190. "I had gone through a divorce and with my income drastically dropping. I had to cut corners," Stemm said. So she spent more than \$3,000 on a deep well. Stemm also installed a \$30 filtration system so it can be the main source of her drinking water.

It's a trend that is growing among customers of Aqua Utilities, which WFTV has reported on numerous occasions for steep rate hikes and questionable water quality.

According to Florida statute, any homeowner can switch from a utility company, even if it's a government municipality, to a water well. However, they have to get a permit.

The Lake County Environmental Health Department issues permits to its residents, and WFTV was told that permits are rarely denied.

Water well contractors said they've installed wells for dozens of Aqua Utilities customers.

However, Stemm isn't free of Aqua Utilities. She still has to pay them a \$15 monthly charge for the water meter on her property.

She's fighting to get the meter removed, but in meantime, is telling other unhappy customers that there are other options.


"Trust me, it's gonna pay for itself in a couple years time," she said.


Customers who still have Aqua Utilities could soon have to pay even more for their water bills.

As a resident of Harbor Hills, I am presenting my formal objection to the enclosed Application for Approval of Transfer of the Water System of Harbor Hills Utility, LP. to Aqua Utilities of Florida.

The particulars of my objections are:

- 1. The Notice says it "is hereby given on the January 7, 2010". The Notice gave me 30 (thirty days) to object. The Notice was received on January 12, 2011 - 370 days after the cited Notice thereby prohibiting me from responding with an objection within 30 days. I believe the Notice must be invalidated because of the date cited.
- 2. The Notice is extremely vague in that it fails to mention anything about surface water. potable water rates or customers affected. Harbor Hills Utilities currently provides surface water to a section of Harbor hills for a fixed monthly rate. Will that service continue under Aqua? Or is Aqua not intending to provide surface water?
- 3. The Notice says that Aqua doe not propose to change rates pursuant to the Application but it offers no comfort that Aqua will not make an application to raise rates immediately after the Application is approved. Research shows that Aqua rates in neighboring communities are 3 to 6 times as high as the current rates charged by Harbor Hills Utilities. In fact, channel 9 news has broadcast horror stories about water quality and exorbitant rate increases that apparently the Commission has approved. This ravaging of the water consumers must be stopped before any approval is granted for the sale of Harbor Hills Utilities to Aqua.
- 4. The Grove at Harbor Hills has an account with Harbor Hills Utilities. The Grove has repeatedly asked Harbor Hills Utilities to send the invoice for consumption to its property manager to no avail. I want to be sure that Aqua Utilities has the capability to properly bill its consumers.
- 5. Harbor Hills Utilities has not invoiced The Grove since May of 2010. Will Aqua be able to correct this situation?

- 6. In May 2010 Harbor Hills Utilities trespassed on Grove property and destroyed irrigation lines, causing serious damage to landscape owned by The Grove. The Grove has filed a claim for damages to its landscape in the Lake County courts. Has HH Utilities disclosed this? Will Aqua assume responsibility for this damage! No responsibility is noted in the Application!
- 7. Will Aqua provide water to Harbor Hills Golf Course? At what cost?
- 8. In a public meeting, Mr. Rich of Harbor Hills Utilities said that he will maintain control over surface water distribution within the Harbor Hills Community. Has there been any filing with the Commission to establish rates for this surface water from Lake Griffin? If not, that is the Commission's position on surface water rates?
- 9. The purchase of the Waste Management System by Aqua will clearly affect the 66 homeowners and the Harbor Hills Country Club who have never been billed for waste water treatment. The purchase by Aqua will surely result in charges for this service. At what price?

Until answers are provided to the above issues, I believe the Commission would be derelict is approving the purchase of selected Harbor Hills Utilities operations by Aqua Utilities.







Since we did not receive this notice until the middle of January 2011, it would be impossible to respond within 30 days or by February 5, 2010. We believe the application should be denied on the basis of Aqua Utilities past record. We have heard some very disturbing accounts from people serviced by Aqua Utilities concerning the quality of their water and their exorbitant prices. WFTV Channel 9 in Orlando also ran a segment in their news on Aqua Utilities where some homeowners in Lake County told Channel 9 that their bills were so high and the water so dirty that they are digging their own wells. (Attach copy obtained from Channel 9 website) In the channel 9 news interview it was stated that their monthly water bills went from approximately \$60 per month. to more than \$190 per month.



Residents Dig Wells To Bypass Water Company

LAKE COUNTY, Fla. -- A troubled water company is causing more problems Friday. Some homeowners in Lake County told WFTV that their bills are so high, and their water is so dirty, that they're digging their own wells.

Barbara Stemm moved into the Scottish Highlands subdivision, which is serviced by Aqua Utilities, just over two years ago. But in period of a year, she said her monthly water bill rose from \$60 to more than \$190. "I had gone through a divorce and with my income drastically dropping. I had to cut corners," Stemm said. So she spent more than \$3,000 on a deep well. Stemm also installed a \$30 filtration system so it can be the main source of her drinking water.

It's a trend that is growing among customers of Aqua Utilities, which WFTV has reported on numerous occasions for steep rate hikes and questionable water quality.

According to Florida statute, any homeowner can switch from a utility company, even if it's a government municipality, to a water well. However, they have to get a permit.

The Lake County Environmental Health Department issues permits to its residents, and WFTV was told that permits are rarely denied.

Water well contractors said they've installed wells for dozens of Aqua Utilities customers.

However, Stemm isn't free of Aqua Utilities. She still has to pay them a \$15 monthly charge for the water meter on her property.

She's fighting to get the meter removed, but in meantime, is telling other unhappy customers that there are other options.

"Trust me, it's gonna pay for itself in a couple years time," she said.

Customers who still have Aqua Utilities could soon have to pay even more for their water bills.

Aqua Utilities wants to raise its rates again by more than 25 percent. The Public Service Commission will vote on the hike request next month.

The undersigned hereby object to the afore cited application, (copy enclosed) and respectfully request, suggest and demand that said application be denied, not approved, without prejudice with the provision that the application may be resubmitted at a later date, not sooner than February 7, 2012, (one year from February 7, 2011).

Denial of the application will give the consumers, parties served by this Utility, the opportunity to become informed regarding the subject transfer. This additional time is appropriate, in that the consumers, rate-payers have not been properly informed in a timely manner regarding an event that will dramatically impact on their environmental and economic well-being. This additional time will allow alternatives to the proposed takeover to be considered by all the parties, and in particular the consumers, rate-payers.

Specifics to the objection are:

Harbor Hills Utility, LP, and none of the affiliated entities cited in the application did not inform the affected rate-payers of the impending transfer. The contract of sales is dated March 31, 2010, with an indicated earlier date of September 2009.

Harbor Hills Utility, LP and the affiliated entities, in particular the Managing Partner, H.H.C.C. Inc., and Michael Rich, who is a Chief Executive Officer of these entities and the President of the Harbor Hills Homeowners Association board of directors, may have had an obligation to inform in a timely manner the Homeowners, (members of the Harbor Hills Homeowners Association) of these negotiations. The absence of such information has denied the Homeowners (rate-payers) the opportunity to consider alternatives that may be more attractive and beneficial to the Utility and the community.

Total Capital Applied	\$1	,200,000.

- 2) Creation of a special district for rate-payer's ownership of the Utility. This could be financed by amortization in the rate structure.
- 3) Other creative alternatives may be available had the concerned parties been timely informed of the Utility transfer.

Further objection is made in that there is no listing of negotiations with any other entity other than Aqua. There may be other utilities that are better equipped to serve the needs of the Harbor Hills Community.



The undersigned hereby object to the afore cited application, (copy enclosed) and respectfully request, suggest and demand that said application be denied, not approved, without prejudice with the provision that the application may be resubmitted at a later date, not sooner than February 6, 2012, (one year from February 6, 2011).

Examination of the Application within the limited time available exposes a gross and significant error in calculations. This error results in a gross distortion of the "Proposed Residential Bill at 5,000 gallons \$40.99" as set forth in the attached exhibit which I have identified as page 40 of the application.

The error occurs in the attached exhibit which I have identified as page 42 of the Application. The subject exhibit projects an annual increase in ERCs for each year, 2011 – 2015. There is no evidence to support these projections. To the contrary, economic forecasts indicate no increase in ERC's for this time frame.

The forecast of 131 ERC's for 2014, and 148 ERC's for 2015 is an overstatement of 68% for 2014, and an overstatement of 90% for 2015. The more economically sound and evidentiary logical projection is that there will be no increase in ERCs during the subject period.

The above cited un-defendable errors in projections, result in an erroneous presentation of a Proposed Residential Bill for 2014 as set forth in the attached exhibit. The overstatement of ERCs results in an understatement of the "Gallonage Charge" as stated in this exhibit.



Please attach the following addendum to our February 2, 2011 letter of objection.

The undersigned hereby object to the afore cited application, (copy enclosed) and respectfully request, suggest and demand that said application be denied, not approved, without prejudice with the provision that the application may be resubmitted at a later date, not sooner than February 6, 2012, (one year from February 6, 2011).

Examination of the Application within the limited time available exposes a gross and significant error in calculations. This error results in a gross distortion of the "Proposed Residential Bill at 5,000 gallons \$40.99" as set forth in the attached exhibit which I have identified as page 40 of the application.

The error occurs in the attached exhibit which I have identified as page 42 of the Application. The subject exhibit projects an annual increase in ERCs for each year, 2011 – 2015. There is no evidence to support these projections. To the contrary, economic forecasts indicate no increase in ERC's for this time frame.

The forecast of 131 ERC's for 2014, and 148 ERC's for 2015 is an overstatement of 68% for 2014, and an overstatement of 90% for 2015. The more economically sound and evidentiary logical projection is that there will be no increase in ERCs during the subject period.

The above cited un-defendable errors in projections, result in an erroneous presentation of a Proposed Residential Bill for 2014 as set forth in the attached exhibit. The overstatement of ERCs results in an understatement of the "Gallonage Charge" as stated in this exhibit.

The correction of these errors translates into the following corrected restatement and demonstrated understatement of the "Proposed Residential Bill at 5,000 gallons \$40.99"



My husband and I own two houses in The Grove at Harbor Hills, and are concerned about the letter we received regarding the selling of Harbor Hills Utilities to Aqua Utilities Florida.

On January 12, 2011 we received a letter from Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc. stating that notice is given that an Application for Approval of Transfer of the Water System of Harbor Hills Utility, L.P. in Lake County, Florida to Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc. and Amendment of AUF's Certificate No. 106W. This letter notes that any objections to the Application must be filed in writing with your office within 30 days of the notice. This is pursuant to Section 367.071, Florida Statutes. The notice is dated January 7, 2010 We are very concerned that the letter was received a year after the date a reply is due.

We object not only to the lack of accurate detail in sending out such a notice, but to the lack of information from Harbor Hills Utility regarding this request.

We wonder if the fact that Harbor Hills Utilities is a Defendant in a counterclaim suit filed by The Grove at Harbor Hills will affect the proposed sale of the Utility?

The letter states "Aqua does not propose to change rates pursuant to this Application." Does this mean it cannot raise rates, and if that is the case, for what period of time?

Attached is an item that was on the local television station regarding the quality of water distributed by AUF and the ever increasing cost for providing it. We are concerned the same thing will occur in Harbor Hills. You can access the television news item by going to the website listed at the bottom of this attachment.

Our other concerns include:

- Does this transfer refer to potable as well as surface water from Lake Griffin.
- Is the transfer for residential services as well as commercial areas of REDATE Harbor Hills,

- What experience does AUF have with obtaining, distributing and charging for surface water from a lake,
- What experience does AUF have with delivering, potable water to residences and businesses,
- Is AUF governed by the Public Service Commission, if so has it ruled on this transfer request,
- How many complaints have been filed against AUF by its customers,
- How long has AUF been in business,
- What is the solvency status of AUF,
- What is the AUF's rating with the Better Business Bureaus of the areas it serves,
- How many cities and or towns do they serve,
- How many golf communities do they serve,
- How many mobile home parks do they serve,
- Has Harbor Hills Utilities looked into alternate companies as potential purchasers,
- Has Harbor Hills looked into alternate solutions other than transferring its assets to another company

If AUF is so lackadaisical about making sure the first correspondence sent to potential customers is correct, by allowing it to be sent out with a date that is inaccurate by over one year, why should we trust it will be accurate and responsible about providing the water that is sent to our homes?

We urge you to deny this request until a full and complete hearing is held so the residents of Harbor Hills can have adequate input and have their questions answered.



Unhappy Aqua Utilities Customers Dig Own Wells

LAKE COUNTY, Fla. -- A troubled water company is causing more problems Friday. Some homeowners in Lake County told WFTV that their bills are so high, and their water is so dirty, that they're digging their own wells.

Barbara Stemm moved into the Scottish Highlands subdivision, which is serviced by Aqua Utilities, just over two years ago. But in period of a year, she said her monthly water bill rose from \$60 to more than \$190.

"I had gone through a divorce and with my income drastically dropping. I had to cut corners," Stemm said.

So she spent more than \$3,000 on a deep well. Stemm also installed a \$30 filtration system so it can be the main source of her drinking water.

It's a trend that is growing among customers of Aqua Utilities, which WFTV has reported on numerous occasions for steep rate hikes and questionable water quality.

According to Florida statute, any homeowner can switch from a utility company, even if it's a government municipality, to a water well. However, they have to get a permit.

The Lake County Environmental Health Department issues permits to its residents, and WFTV was told that permits are rarely denied.

Water well contractors said they've installed wells for dozens of Aqua Utilities customers.

However, Stemm isn't free of Aqua Utilities. She still has to pay them a \$15 monthly charge for the water meter on her property.

She's fighting to get the meter removed, but in meantime, is telling other unhappy customers that there are other options.

"Trust me, it's gonna pay for itself in a couple years time," she said.

Customers who still have Aqua Utilities could soon have to pay even more for their water bills.

Aqua Utilities wants to raise its rates again by more than 25 percent. The Public Service Commission will vote on the hike request next month.
