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On Feb. 28, 2025 Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) submitted a request to the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC) for the Commission to consider approving the setting of new (higher) service rates.

FPL argues that adding 275,000 customers since 2021 and an expected 335,000 more customers by 2029 will require significant new infrastructure to meet demand. FPL implies that they will bear the costs of this new infrastructure.

I am of the opinion that an increased usage rate is not demonstrated. This is because: 1) new customers will provide new revenues. 2) New Community Development Districts (CDDs) will supply infrastructure. And 3) Given the current political-fiscal direction, "costs" are on a downward trend.
