I'm writing concerning the potential water & sewer billing increase as referenced above in the subject line. I'm an owner (age 70.5) at Grenelefe Condominiums in Haines City, FL. For the record, our large spread-out condominium complex is composed of many separate units built in the late 1970's and early 1980's. Most of the residents are elderly, retired people who choose this area because it's somewhat removed from the hustle and bustle of the greater Orlando area and because it's one of the most affordable areas, if not the most affordable area, to live in the greater outlying Orlando area. The location is several miles out into what used to be orange groves and other fruit/vegetable growing areas east of

Highway 27 and slightly north of Haines City proper. The value of our units, unfortunately, has actually dropped due to the age of the buildings and the remote location. Most folks here are on a fixed budget and the plans to put a large financial burden on us with our water/sewer bills is going to be very damaging to the residents of Grenelefe. I'm asking that you folks seriously reconsider this adjustment and calculate a different, more friendly method of raising money for your project. Pursuing your current plans will unreasonably burden the elderly population living on a fixed income, if this is your final decision. Thank you for your attention to this serious matter.
