We were told in reference to the redevelopment of Grenelefe that the developer would foot the bill for the upgrades needed to the water facility, HE owns, to facilitate HIS development of new homes. HE said existing homeowners would not bear any costs. HE has specifically agreed to this with the Polk County Commissioners and sent a letter to the PSC in this regard.

Most of the residents in our community are young working families, renters and senior citizens such as ourselves. Most would agree that rate hikes are an inevitable fact of life however the rates the PSC "staff" is suggesting are astronomically high. None of us asked for this redevelopment and were told it was at no cost to us.
