I strongly oppose the water rate increase Sunlake Estates Utilities, LLC (SEUL)- DOCKET NO.220250108-WS in Lake County FL. This drastic increase (78% to 190%) is unwarranted and will place a significant financial burden on most households in our Community.

Since 2023 there has been 10 Waterman breaks, 29 breaks in 2024 and 15 breaks in 2025.

The monthly invoice payments are made to SUN, Inc. contact information for SLEU isn't noted anywhere on our bill.

Many residents in this 55+ community are on a fixed income, and this increase will force them to choose between water service and other essentials.

The 5+% rent increase this year and projected 7% rent increase next year, increased water rate and overall significant increase in all aspect of daily living expenses would make it impossible for most seniors to sustain a healthy, comfortable lifestyle they worked their entire lives to enjoy.

So I am asking you to take under consideration what is better for the people who lived in Sunlake Estates.
