FINAL ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

In 1990, thirty (30) interexchange carriers (IXCs) did not file their 1989 Annual Report by the prescribed January 31, 1990 deadline. At the April 17, 1990 Agenda Conference, we voted to initiate show cause proceedings against 28 of these IXCs for violation of Rule 25-24.480, Florida Administrative Code. The show cause orders were issued May 7, 1990. A written response was due by May 28, 1990. In the alternative, the order set out a settlement proposal, a response to which was due by June 7, 1990.

On May 22, 1990, LD\*OS filed a response to the show cause order, Order No. 22897, stating that the company no longer provided long distance services as of January, 1989. In its response, LD\*OS also requested that its Certificate No. 2006 be cancelled.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that LD\*OS Certificate of Public Necessity and Convenience, Certificate No. 2006, be cancelled. It is further

ORDERED that the fine proposed in Order No. 22897 be waived. It is further

ORDERED that this docket be closed.

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NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.59(4), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Any party adversely affected by the Commission's final action in this matter may request: 1) reconsideration of the decision by filing a motion for reconsideration with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting within fifteen (15) days of the issuance of this order in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code; or 2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water or sewer utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days after the issuance of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
