### CASE BACKGROUND

Peoples Telephone Company has submitted a request to block incoming calls at its pay telephone located at 6511 NW 12th Avenue, Miami, Florida. The request was submitted on a properly completed Form PSC/CMU 2 (12/94).

The Waiver Petition was filed on August 19, 1998. The Notice of Petition for Waiver was submitted to the Secretary of State for publication in the Florida Administrative Weekly September 2, 1998. The comment period ended September 26, 1998. No comments were submitted. The statutory deadline for the Commission's decision regarding this petition was waived by Peoples Telephone.

This item was deferred from the November 3, 1998 Agenda Conference at the Commissioners' request to allow staff time to gather additional information from the Miami Police Department.

Staff wrote the Miami Police Chief and asked for the additional information on November 5, 1998. Chief William E. O'Brien responded on November 24. (ATTACHMENT A) Staff believes the following recommendations are appropriate.

**DISCUSSION OF ISSUES**

**ISSUE 1:** Should the Commission grant Peoples Telephone Company a waiver from the requirement that each telephone station shall allow incoming calls for the pay telephone numbers at the Pyramid Funding Corporation located at 6511 NW 12th Avenue, Miami, Florida?

**RECOMMENDATION:** Yes. (Isler)

**STAFF ANALYSIS:** Rule 25-24.515(8), Florida Administrative Code, provides in the pertinent part:

Each telephone station shall allow incoming calls to be received, with the exception of those located at penal institutions, hospitals and schools, and at locations specifically exempted by the Commission. There shall be no charge for receiving incoming calls. Requests for exemption from the requirement that each telephone station allow incoming calls shall be accompanied by a completed FORM PSC/CMU-2 (12/94), which is incorporated into this rule by reference.

Peoples Telephone Company has submitted a properly completed Request to Block Incoming Calls form for the instrument located at 6511 NW 12th Avenue, Miami, Florida. Staff has reviewed the form and found it to have been signed by an officer of the pay telephone company, the location owner, and the chief of the law enforcement agency of the jurisdiction in which the pay telephone is located.

By signing FORM PSC/CMU-2 (12/94), the company has agreed to provide central office-based intercept at no charge to the end-user and to prominently display a written notice directly above or below the telephone number which states "Incoming calls blocked at the request of law enforcement." Furthermore, there is language on the form above each of the three parties' signatures which states "I am aware that pursuant to Section 837.06, Florida Statutes, whoever knowingly makes a false statement in writing with the intent to mislead a public-servant in the performance of his official duty shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree."

At the November 3, 1998, Agenda Conference, this item was deferred at the Commissioners' request. Staff was requested to gather additional information from the Miami Police Department. Staff wrote the Police Chief on November 5, 1998 and requested the

Chief to explain how granting an incoming call waiver would eliminate or help control any criminal activity. Staff also requested any written documentation that would support the request such as police reports, citizen complaints, or community policing action plans.

Police Chief William E. O'Brien responded on November 24 and stated that he had received several complaints from the residents at this location that narcotics dealers and users constantly hang around the phone and conduct illicit transactions. Chief O'Brien provided staff with a computer printout of the crime analysis report for this location between January 1 and November 16, 1998, which showed a total of 43 calls from residents. Chief O'Brien stated that 95% of the arrests and calls were narcotics related. Chief O'Brien stated that "It would be unfair to punish law-abiding residents in our attempt to abate this nuisance. Instead of removing the phone, it is suggested that all incoming calls be blocked." In addition, Chief O'Brien stated that "Blocking incoming calls will eventually slow down criminal activities in the area."

Based on Miami Police Chief O'Brien's response, staff recommends that the waiver requested in this docket should be granted. The waiver is being requested in accordance with the requirements of Chapter 120.542(2), Florida Statutes. Peoples Telephone has demonstrated that granting this waiver will not impede the continued provision of pay telephone service to the using public as intended by the underlying statute, Chapter 364.345, Florida Statutes.

In addition, the petitioner has demonstrated that granting this waiver will lift the "substantial hardship" that the rule imposes on law enforcement and the location provider.

**ISSUE 2:** Should this docket be closed?

**RECOMMENDATION:** Yes, this docket should be closed unless a person whose substantial interests are affected by the Commission's decision files a protest within 21 days of the issuance of the Proposed Agency Action. (Watts)

**STAFF ANALYSIS:** Whether staff's recommendation on Issue 1 is approved or denied, the result will be a proposed agency action order. If no timely protest to the proposed agency action is filed within 21 days of the date of issuance of the Order, this docket should be closed.

Dear Attorney Watts:

I am in receipt of your letter dated November 5, 1998, in which you asked for our assistance with a Request to Block Incoming Calls for the payphone located at the Pyramid Funding Corporation, 6511 NW 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Miami, pay telephone number (305) 754-9960. In response to your letter, I offer the following:

The Model City NET Office has received several complaints from the residents of 6511 NW 12 Avenue. The primary complaint is that narcotics dealers and users constantly hang around the phone and conduct illicit transactions. Ninety-five percent (95%) of the arrests and calls for service are narcotics related. It would be unfair to punish the law-abiding residents in our attempt to abate this nuisance. Instead of removing the phone, it is suggested that all incoming calls be blocked.

The Crime Suppression Unit of the North District also made several arrests at said location. Known drug dealers use this payphone to make illegal narcotic transactions. Blocking incoming calls will eventually slow down criminal activities in the area.

Attached is a copy of crime analysis report for said address.
