In re: Compliance investigation of AAV Certificate No. 8512, issued to Global Telecom & Technology Americas, Inc., for apparent first-time violation of Rule 25-4.0161, F.A.C., Regulatory Assessment Fees; Telecommunications Companies.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED AGENCY ACTION ORDER IMPOSING PENALTIES AND COLLECTION COSTS, AND REQUIRING PAYMENT OF DELINQUENT REGULATORY ASSESSMENT FEE, OR CANCELLING ALTERNATIVE ACCESS VENDOR CERTIFICATE FOR VIOLATION OF RULE 25-4.0161, FLORIDA ADMINISTRATIVE CODE

BY THE COMMISSION:

NOTICE is hereby given by the Florida Public Service Commission that the action discussed herein is preliminary in nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are substantially affected files a petition for a formal proceeding, pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

Pursuant to Rule 25-4.0161(10) and (11), Florida Administrative Code, telecommunications companies that fail to pay the Regulatory Assessment Fee, including any statutory late payment charges, within 15 days after receiving a delinquent notice, shall be automatically penalized \$500 for a first offense, \$1,000 for a second offense, and \$2,000 for a third offense. The penalty amounts include collection costs. If an entity fails to pay the Regulatory Assessment Fee in full, including any statutory late payment charges, along with the penalty amount, that entity's certificate shall be cancelled. In this case, Global Telecom & Technology Americas, Inc. has not paid the fee within 15 days after receiving the delinquent notice.

Pursuant to Section 364.336, Florida Statutes, certificate holders must pay a minimum annual Regulatory Assessment Fee if the certificate was active during any portion of the calendar year. Pursuant to Rule 25-4.0161(2), Florida Administrative Code, the form and applicable fees are due to the Florida Public Service Commission by January 30 of the subsequent year. Pursuant to Section 350.113(4), Florida Statutes, the Regulatory Assessment Fee return forms, for the period of January 1 through December 31, are mailed to entities at least 45 days prior to the date that payment of the fee is due.

The Division of Administrative Services advised that Global Telecom & Technology Americas, Inc., Company Code TA073, failed to comply with Section 364.336, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-4.0161, Florida Administrative Code.

Accordingly, we hereby find it appropriate to cancel Global Telecom & Technology Americas, Inc.'s alternative access vendor (AAV) certificate for failure to comply with Section 364.336, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-4.0161, Florida Administrative Code, unless the entity pays a penalty and cost of collection, together totaling \$500, and remits the past due Regulatory Assessment Fee, along with any accrued statutory late payment charges, to the Florida Public Service Commission.

If this Order is not protested, Global Telecom & Technology Americas, Inc.'s AAV certificate shall be cancelled. If the entity pays the penalty and cost of collection, together totaling \$500, and remits the past due Regulatory Assessment Fee, along with any accrued statutory late payment charges, prior to the expiration of the Proposed Agency Action Order, then Global Telecom & Technology Americas, Inc.'s AAV certificate will remain active. If the entity fails to protest the Order or pay the penalty and cost of collection, together totaling \$500, and fails to remit the past due Regulatory Assessment Fee, along with any accrued statutory late payment charges, prior to the expiration of the Proposed Agency Action Order, then Global Telecom & Technology Americas, Inc.'s AAV certificate shall be cancelled administratively, and the collection of any unpaid Regulatory Assessment Fees shall be referred to the Florida Department of Financial Services for further collection efforts. If the AAV certificate is cancelled in accordance with this Commission's Order, the company shall immediately cease and desist providing alternative access vendor service in Florida. This docket shall be closed administratively either upon receipt of the payment of the penalty and cost of collection, together totaling \$500, and the past due Regulatory Assessment Fees along with any accrued statutory late payment charges, or upon cancellation of Global Telecom & Technology Americas, Inc.'s AAV certificate. If the entity's AAV certificate is cancelled in accordance with this Order and it subsequently decides to reapply for a certificate, Global Telecom & Technology Americas, Inc. shall be required to first pay the penalty and cost of collection, together totaling \$500 and any outstanding fees, including all accrued statutory late payment charges. We are vested with jurisdiction over these matters pursuant to Sections 350.113, 364.285, 364.336, and 364.337, Florida Statutes.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that Global Telecom & Technology Americas, Inc. shall pay a penalty and cost of collection, together totaling \$500, and the past due Regulatory Assessment Fee, including any statutory late payment charges, to the Florida Public Service Commission for failure to comply with Section 364.336, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-4.0161, Florida Administrative Code, by the end of the protest period. The cost of collection will be subtracted from any monies collected as payment (full or partial) of the penalty and cost of collection, and will be deposited, along with the past due Regulatory Assessment Fee, in the Florida Public Service Commission Regulatory Trust Fund, pursuant to Section 350.113, Florida Statutes. The statutory late payment charges and any portion of the penalty exceeding the cost of collection will be remitted to the Florida Department of Financial Services for deposit in the State of Florida General Revenue Fund, pursuant to Section 364.285(1), Florida Statutes. It is further

ORDERED that should Global Telecom & Technology Americas, Inc. fail to comply with this Order, the entity's certificate shall be cancelled. It is further

ORDERED that the cancellation of the certificate in no way diminishes Global Telecom & Technology Americas, Inc.'s obligation to pay the applicable Regulatory Assessment Fees and any accrued statutory late payment charges. If Global Telecom & Technology Americas, Inc. has its certificate cancelled, and subsequently decides to reapply for a telecommunications certificate, the company shall be required to first pay any outstanding penalties and cost of collection and fees, including accrued statutory late payment charges. Any unpaid Regulatory Assessment Fees, and accrued statutory late payment charges, shall be referred to the Florida Department of Financial Services for further collection efforts. It is further

ORDERED that if Global Telecom & Technology Americas, Inc.'s certificate is cancelled in accordance with this Order, the company shall immediately cease and desist providing alternative access vendor service in Florida. It is further

ORDERED that the provisions of this Order, issued as proposed agency action, shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order unless an appropriate petition, in the form provided by Rule 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code, is received by the Office of Commission Clerk, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, by the close of business on the date set forth in the "Notice of Further Proceedings" attached hereto. It is further

ORDERED that in the event this Order becomes final, this docket shall be closed upon receipt of the imposed penalty and cost of collection, together totaling \$500, and the Regulatory Assessment Fee, including statutory late payment charges or upon cancellation of Global Telecom & Technology Americas, Inc.'s AAV certificate.

In the absence of such a petition, this order shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order.

Any objection or protest filed in this/these docket(s) before the issuance date of this order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.
