AT&T'S RESPONSE, OBJECTIONS, AND MOTION FOR PROTECTIVE ORDER WITH RESPECT TO CITIZENS' FIRST SET OF REQUESTS FOR PRODUCTION OF DOCUMENTS TO AT&T COMMUNICATIONS OF THE SOUTHERN STATES, INC.

Pursuant to Rule 25-22.025 and Rule 25-22.034, Florida Administrative Code, as well as, Rule 1.350 and Rule 1.280, Florida Rules of Civil Procedure, AT&T Communications of the Southern States, Inc. ("AT&T") submits its Response, Objections and Motion for Protective Order With Respect to Citizens' First Set of Requests for Production of Documents in the abovereferenced case.

General Objections

1. AT&T objects to Citizens' First Set of Requests for Production of Documents in the above-referenced case on the grounds that the instant proceeding is a rulemaking proceeding in which discovery rights do not apply. The instant proceeding is being conducted pursuant to the provisions of Section 120.54, Florida Statutes, and the provisions of Part II (Rulemaking Proceedings) of the Florida Public Service Commission's ("Commission") Rules of Practice and Procedure, Chapter 25-22, Florida Administrative Code. Pursuant to Rule 25-22.025, Florida Administrative Code, the discovery provisions of Rule 25-22.034, Florida Administrative Code, apply only to proceedings DOCUMENT NUMPER-DATE

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conducted pursuant to Part IV (Decisions Determining Substantial Interests) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure. Since this proceeding has not been designated as a proceeding determining substantial interests, Citizens' Request for Production of Documents is improper and without legal basis.

Motion for Protective Order

To the extent that either the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure or the Florida Rules of Civil Procedure require a Motion for a Protective Order with respect to Citizens' First Set of Requests for Production of Documents, AT&T respectfully requests that the Commission issue such an order protecting AT&T from discovery that is not permitted by the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure. As grounds for such motion, AT&T submits the arguments set forth in the General Objection stated above.
