Florida Power Corporation (FPC), hereby submits its List of Issues and Positions with respect to its Energy Conservation Cost Recovery (ECCR) factors for the period of April 1995 through March 1996, and states as follows:

Generic Conservation Cost Recovery Issues

 <u>ISSUE</u>: What is the final end-of-the-period true-up amount for the period October 1, 1993 through September 30, 1994?

FPC: \$9,528,276 over-recovery

 <u>ISSUE</u>: What is the appropriate conservation cost recovery factors for the period April 1995 through March 1996?

 <u>ISSUE</u>: Are all the utilities participating in the conservation cost recovery clause entitled to recover their advertising expenses incurred during the period October 1993 through September 1994?

FPC: With respect to FPC, yes.

 ISSUE: Should the Commission open a docket to establish standards for the energy claims made in advertisements and promotional literature related to ECCR? Some of the related variables are energy efficiency, energy consumption, equipment costs, etc.

FPC: No position at this time.
